THE Prince of Aliano, the newly appointed Vice-Roy of Sicily, is preparing to depart for Palermo in a few Days. A Regiment of Cavalry from hence and a Regiment of Infantry from the Presidii of Tuscany are ordered to go to Palermo immediately.

The Heats are still violent here. Yesterday the Thermometer was at 83 Degrees.

Vienna, September 17. The Turkish Envoy set out three Days ago with his whole Suite by Water for Belgrade.

St. Idelphonsa, September 19. A Disorder having appeared amongst the Cattle in Navarre, proper Orders have been issued to prevent the Infection from spreading into other Parts of these Kingdoms.

Stockholm, September 20. Last Saturday the Camp in Scania was to break up, and the King of Sweden proposed to go, as this Day, to Carlscrona, to take a View of the Fleet and Works; from thence his Majesty intends to set out for Gripsholm, and remain there some Weeks to hasten the Repairs which are making. The Duke and Dutchess of Sudermania will take the Route of Gothenburg in their Return to this Capital.

Turin, September 24. Their Sardinian Majesties went last Week to the Castle of Aglié, about sixteen Miles from this Place, belonging to his Royal Highness the Duke of Chablais, with whom they stayed three Days, and were most magnificently entertained. This Court proposes going from Moncalier to Stupiniggi on Monday, and remaining there till Friday, to take the Diversion of Stag-hunting. At the same Time his Sardinian Majesty will review a Regiment or two of Dragoons now in that Neighbourhood.

Bonn, September 26. The Elector of Mentz set out on the 23d Instant for Aichaffenbourg, attended by the Family of Count Harrach of Vienna, Madame Erthal of Wurtzbourg, the Grand Ecuyer, his Lady, and his Sister-in-Law.

Hague, October 4. The Prince of Orange has been indisposed for two or three Days with a feverish Cold, but is now perfectly recovered.

St. James's, September 24, 1774.
