P R SENT, E The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS an Act of Parliament was passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, intituled, "An Act to im-"power His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Salt Petre, and to enforce the Law for impowering His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Canpowder, or any Sort of Arms and Immunition; and also to impower His Majesty "Immunition; and also to impower His Majefly to restrain the Carrying Coastwise of Salt Petre, "Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition:" And His Majesty, judging it necessary to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, out of this Kingdom, or carrying the same Coastwise, for Erica Time, coth therefore, with the Advice of Eric Time, coth therefore, with the Advice of His Frive Council, hereby Order, Require, Prohibit, and Command, That no Person or Persons whatsoever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance, for His Majesty's Service) do, at any Time, during the Space of Six Months from the Time, during the Space of Six Months from the Date of this Order in Council, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Ceastwise, any Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Am municion, or saip or lade any Gunpowder, or any Som of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coastwife, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and suf-fering the respective Forsitures and Penalties indicted by the aforementioned Act. And the Lords Commissioners of His Majeley's Treasury, the Colomissioners for executing the Calce of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Mader-General of the Ordnance, and His Majessy's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
