HEREAS His Majesty was pleased. by His Order in Council of the 5th of October, 1770, to direct, That no Horned Cattle, nor any Manner of Hides, Skins, Horns, Hoofs, or other Part of any Horned Cattle or Beaft, nor any Hay, Straw, Litter, Fodder, or other Things which have been employed about infected Cattle, or the Hides or any other Part of fuch Cattle, or have been in or near the Places where any fuch Infection hath been, and are liable to retain the fame, fhould be imported from any Ports or other Places on the Coaft of France, within the Districts of Picardje, Normandie, and Bretagne, into the Kingdom of Great Britain or Ireland, or any of the Islands or Dominions thereto belonging; And whereas Information hath been received, that an epidemical Diftemper has broke out amongst the Horned Cattle in the Neighbourhood of Bourdeaux: His Majesty doth therefore judge it proper to extend the afore-mentioned Prohibition, and accordingly doth, by and with the Advice of His-Privy Council, hereby Order and Command, That no Horned Cattle, nor any Manner of Hides, Skins, Horns, Hoofs, or other Part of any Horned Cattle or Beaft, nor any Hay, Straw, Litter, Fod-der, or other Things which have been employed abou infected Cattle, or the Hides or any other Part of such Cattle, or have been in or near the Places where any fuch Infection hath been, and are liable to retain the fame, shall from henceforth be imported from any Ports or other Places on the Coaft of France, within the Diftricts afore-mentioned, or from any Ports or other Places within the Diftricts of Poictou. Guienno and Gascogne, into the Kingdom of Great Britain, or Ireland, or any of the Islands or Dominions thereto belonging; —And His Majefty doth further, with the Advice of His Privy Council, strikly Charge and Command all Magistrates, Constables, Officers of the Customs and Excife, to ftop, feize, and deftroy, the feveral Things to prohibited as aforefaid, using and exercifing in that Behalf the like Authority as any Officer or Officers have by any Law now in being, in Cafes of prohibited and uncuftomed Goods. --And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treafury, and the Lord Lieutenant of His Majefty's Kingdom of Ireland, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
