The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS His Majefty was pleafed, by His Order in Council of the 5th of October, 1770, to direct, That no Horned Cattle, nor any Manner of Hides, Skins, Horns, Hoofs, or other Part of any

Horned Cattle or Beast, nor any Hay, Straw, Litter, Fodder, or other Things which have been employed about infected Cattle, or the Hides or any other Part of such Cattle, or have been in or near the Places where any fuch Infection hath been, and are liable to retain the fame, should be imported from any Ports or other Places on the Coaft of France, within the Districts of Picardie, Normandie, and Bretagne, into the Kingdom of Great Britain or Ireland, or any of the Islands or Dominions thereto belonging'; And whereas Information hath been received, that an ep demical Diftemper has broke out amongst the Horned Cattle in the Neighbourhood of Bourdeaux: His Majefty doth therefore judge it proper to extend the afore-mentioned Prohibition, and accordingly doth, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order and Command, That no Horned Cattle, nor any Manner of Hides, Skins, Horns, Hoofs, or other Part of any Horned Cattle or Beaft, nor any Hay, Straw, Litter, Fodder, or other Things which have been employed about in ected Cattle, or the Hides or any other Part of such Cattle, or have been in or near the Places where any fuch Infection hath been, and are liable to retain the fame, shall from henceforth be imported from any Ports or other Places on the Coaft of France, within the Diffricts afore-mentioned, or from any Ports or other Places within the Diffricts of Poictou, Guienne and Gascogne, into the King-dom of Great Britain, or Ireland, or any of the Islands or Dominions thereto belonging; —And His Majefty doth further, with the Advice of His Privy Council, frictly Charge and Command all Magisfrates, Constables, Officers of the Customs and Excise, to stop, feize, and destroy, the several Things to prohibited as aforefaid, using and exer-cifing in that Behalf the like Authority as any Officer or Officers have by any Law now in being, in Cafes of prohibited and uncuftomed Goods. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lord Lieutenant of His Majesty's Kingdom of Ireland, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

A T the Court at St. James's, the 28th Day of 1 to reftrain the Carrying Conftwife of Salt Petre, "Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammuni-tion:" And His Majefty, judging it nec.ffary to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, out of this Kingdom, or carrying the fame Coaftwife, for fome Time, doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, Require, Prohibit, and Command, That no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever (except the Mafter General of the Ordnance, for His Majesty's Service) do, at any Time, during the Space of Six Months from the Date of this Order in Council, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coaftwife, any Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or fhip or lade any Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coaftwife, without Leave or Permiffion in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuf-fering the refpective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by the aforementioned A&. And the Lords Commiffioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein; as to them may respectively appertain.
