Petersburgh, October 11.

A Courier arrived here this Morning from Casan, with a Confirmation of the News of Pugatcheff's being taken and secured at Yaick.

A Detachment of the Horse Guards set out this Day on their March to Moscow; and every Thing is arranged for the March of the Foot Guards, which will take Place in the Course of this and the next Month.

Marshal Czernichew likewise set out this Morning for his Government of White Russia.

Copenhagen, October 25. On Friday last the 21st Infant, (the Day of the Marriage of his Royal Highness Prince Frederick with the Princess Sophia Frederica, Niece to the reigning Duke of Mecklenbourg-Schwerin) the following Promotions were made, viz. His Serene Highness Prince Lewis of Mecklenbourg, Father to the Princess, and five others, Knights of the Elephant; eleven Knights of the Order of Danebrog; four new Privy Counsellors of Conference; three Privy Councillors; thirteen Chamberlains; one Rear-Admiral; a new Master of the Ceremonies; and a great many Promotions of inferior Rank. The Festivals and Rejoicings on this Occasion continued three Days.

Dublin, October 23.

This Day being the Anniversary of the Irish Rebellion in the Year 1641, the same was observed in this City with the usual Demonstrations of Joy. The Right Honourable the Lord Mayor, Recorder, Aldermen, Sheriffs, and Common Council, went to Christ Church, where an excellent Sermon, suitable to the Occasion, was preached by the Reverend Dr. Caulfeild.

Dublin, October 26.

Yesterday being the Anniversary of His Majesty's happy Accession to the Throne, in the Morning the Flag was displayed on Bedford Tower, the Great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired three Rounds, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn out in the Royal Square at the Barracks. In the Evening a Play was given by his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant for the Entertainment of the Ladies; and the Night concluded with Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy.
