This morning the Bishop of Osnabrug is parted from Wevelinghove, where he hath for some time had his quarters in this Diocels, on his return to Ofnabrug, leaving the command of his Troops to Major-General Uffelen, in the absence of Monsieur Louvigny, who is at present at Coblents, to confer with the Elector of Trier, as is faid, about matters relating to the next Campagne. Three Regiments of the Duke of Neuhourgs have passed the Rhine at Bonne in order to their going into their Winter quarters in the Countrey of Berg. The Sieur Judeci the Imperial Commissary hath had leveral Conferences with the Deputies of our Elefrom to regulate the Winter-quarters for the Ofnabrug Troops, of whom the poor Countrey people in the mean time make great complaints. From Neubonrg, where the Duke of that name hath for fome time had his residence, they write, That the Prince of Dietrichstein the Emperors Ambassador was arrived there, and that on the 25 past the Imperial Bride was for the first time treated with the stile of Majesty; and on the 27 following was to part thence, accompanied by her Father and Mother, on her journey to Passaw; on which occasion the Duke of Neubourg would meet and confer with the Elector of Bavaria at Straubingen.
