*Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King,  
That on Sunday Night last, at Half an Hour  
past Nine o'Clock, a Fire broke out in the Timber Yard  
of Mr. Thomas Flight, in the old Artillery Ground ad-  
joining to Tabernacle Walk, which burnt a very great  
Quantity of Timber, Deals, and other Things, together
