*Westminster, November 29.*

**T**HIS Day the Parliament met; His Majesty went to the House of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes, seated on the Throne with the usual Solemnity, Sir Francis Molyneux, Knt. Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, was sent with a Message to the House of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers; the Commons being come thither, His Majesty signified His Pleasure to them by the Lord High Chancellor, that they should return to their House and chuse their Speaker, and present him to His Majesty for His Royal Approbation Tomorrow at Two o'Clock. They returned accordingly, and unanimously chose Sir Fletcher Norton, Knt. to be their Speaker.
