Constantinople, November 3.

COLONEL Peterfon, Chargé d'Affaires from the Russian Camp, had his Audience of the Vizir on Monday last: He was distinguished in the Attendance the Porte sent him, and had a Pelice of Ermine. The Russian Officers were released from the Seven Towers on Friday last.

Prince Repnin is expected here towards the Middle of January: The Ambassador from the Porte proposes to set out the latter End of this Month; the two Ambassadors are to meet at Haacci.

Turin, December 3. The King of Sardinia, and all the Royal Family, returned from Montcalier to this City on Wednesday last. His Majesty proposed staying some Days longer there, but was driven hither by the extreme Severity of the Weather, which is colder than has been known at this Season for many Years past. His Majesty was indisposed, and kept his Bed one Day, but is now perfectly recovered.

N. B. By the beforementioned Act, whoever forges or counterfeits the above described Mark, or knowingly sells Weights with such counterfeit Marks, or willfully alters any Weight legally stamped, or uses any Weight so stamped knowing the same to have been altered, will, on Conviction thereof, be liable to the Penalty of Fifty Pounds, (One Moiety to the Informer) or in Default of Payment be imprisoned for three Months.
