THIS Day His Majesty came to the House of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes seated on the Throne with the usual Solemnity, Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, was sent with a Message from His Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers: The Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majesty was pleased to give the Royal Assent to

An Act for continuing and granting to His Majesty certain Duties upon Malt, Mum, Cyder, and Perry, for the Service of the Year One Thousand Seven Hundred and Seventy-five.

An Act to allow the Importation of Indian Corn and Maize, under certain Restrictions, And to One Private Bill.

St. James's, December 24.

The King has been pleased to constitute and appoint the Right Honourable John Earl of Sandwich, John Buller, Esq; the Right Honourable Henry Viscount Palmerston of the Kingdom of Ireland, Charles Spencer, Esq; commonly called Lord Charles Spencer, the Right Honourable Wilmot Viscount Lisburne of the Kingdom of Ireland, the Right Honourable Augustus John Hervey, and Henry Penton, Esq; to be His Majesty's Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great-Britain and Ireland, and the Dominions, Islands, and Territories thereunto respectively belonging.

Hague, December 16. Advice has been received, that the Emperor of Morocco has declared War against the States-General; and that the Period for the Commencement of Hostilities is fixed for the first of next Month.

Ostend, December 21. The Board of Finances have, by an Ordinance of the 13th Instant, prohibited the Exportation of Pease and Beans, as also Meal of all Kinds, except that made from Buckwheat.
