The Duke being presented by the two senior Knights, and, kneel ing down, the Herald drew the Sword, and (kneeling) delivered it to the Sovereign, who the eupon Inighted his Grace. The Duke having killed His Majefty's tland, Green Rod administered the Oath to his Grace; then Green Rod, having received the Entigns of the Order, prefented the fame (kneeling) to the Sovereign upon a Velvet Cushion, who put the Ribbon over the Duke's Left Shoulder, upon which his Grace had again the Honour of Killing His Majetty's Hand. After this the Duke role up. and. making a low Reverence, withdrew in the same Manner as he had entered.
