HIS Day being kept as the Anniverfary of Het Majefty's Birth-day, there was a very numerous and fplendid Appearance of the Nobility, Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Distinction, to compliment Their Majesties upon the Occasion. The Guns in the Park and at the Tower were fired at One o'Clock, and in the Evening there was a Ball at Court, and Illuminations and other publick Demonstrations of loy in London and Westminster.

Hamburg, January 10. The Ice on the Elbe broke up on the 6th Instant, which has enabled the Ships from different Parts, that had been frozen up at Cuxhaven, and in the River near Twilenfleth, to come up to the Pales of this Port, where they fafely arrived on the 8th Inflant.

Hamburg, January 13. On a Report that the Diftemper among the Horned Cattle had lately broken out again in the Counties of Oldenbourg and ken out again in the Counties of Ordenbourg and Delmenhorft, and in the Dutchies of Bremen and Holftein, the Senate gave immediate Orders for enquiring into the Truth of it; and by Letters from Oldenbourg, Pinneberg, and Stade, of the 17th, 28th, and 30th of laft Month, it appears, that in the Counties of Oldenbourg and Delmenhorft the Cattle of only one Houfe in each of the three Villages of Berkhaufen, Neuenbrock, and Habenhausen (in which there is a numerous Stock) had been infected with the Diforder, though in East Friefland the Diffemper had for thefe twelve Months been flowly advancing from one Part to the other ; and it fail continues in the Bishoprick of Munster, and the Lordfhips of Jever, Kniephaufen and Varel. In the Dutchy of Bremen the Mortality among the Cattle had fhewn itfelf in the Courfe of the Monch of December last, in several Houses in one of the Villages of the Diftrict of Lahmstedt, fupposed to have been caused by the Badness of the Food, owing to the rainy Seafon in which it was gathered The Accounts from Pinneberg menlast Summer. tion the Infection having lately made its Appear-ance among the Horned Cattle in fome Parts of Holftein, viz. in the marfhy Grounds of Crempe, at Suderau, Sommer, and Groeland, and in fome other Places, the Lordship of Pinneberg and Elm-shorn excepted.
