N Monday night laft, a small Veffel of Barnstaple homeward bound from Bristol, was by the violence of the wind and weather, forced ashore near the Bar of this Harbor, the Men and the Goods were faved.

Portsmouth, Decemb. 5. You have already heard that feveral of the French fifting fhips were defroyed by the Dutch Capers at Newfoundland, those that remained, being about 20 Sail, arrived fome dayes fince upon the fe Coalts, and 8 or 9 of them had the misfortune to be caft away off of Chichefter, and the reft put in here, and into the Ifle of Wight. On Saturday laft, the Dragon and Portsmouth Frigats failed with the thips bound for Smirna under their Convoy.

Deale, Decemb. 5. Yesterday and this day all the thips that were in the Domnes out ward bound, fuiled, and amongst the reft, those bound for Virginia, the Wind at E, S. Ĕ.

Melazzo, Oftober 27. We have already told you, that the French and Meffinefes hid possessed themselves of Tauormina, as they have fince done of the Castle la Mola, scituate on the Rocks near it, the Garison that was there being necessitated to Capitulate for want of Victuals. All the Neighbouring places and Villages being now under the power of the French, we begin to be very much fireightned here. Our Viceroy is extremely perplexed at this ill fuccels of things, and yet more, to find the great inclination which many of the Nobility, and others of this Kingdom have to the French, and that they hold correspondence with them, by which means the Enemy makes greater progreffes than they would otherwife do. Some of these are in prefent Prifoners, and will be feverely proceeded a-gainft, to be an example to others. On Sunday lath, by order of bur Viceroy, Ibifo was demolifhed alle quitted by the I roops that were there, which at first caufed fome diffutbande here for the people imagined it was done by the Enemy. The Scalesia is at prefent very closely prefled by the French, and we wary much fear that we shall in few dayes hear, thand e pirce is in their hands

Florence, Nov. 25. The affairs of the spaniards in Sicily go ill, for the French have not only taken the Scaleua, and feveral other advantageous Pofts, but in all appearance will make farther progresses this Winter. There are Letters from Rom', which fay that Catanea and Siracufa are already invested, and that the Viceroy of Sicily not being able to keep the Field, had put himfelf into Catanea; but this News coming from hands which are look'd upon to favour the French, it does not yet meet with a general credit, that is, fo much at least as concerns Catanga and Siracufa being invested.

Vienna, Nov. 29. On Monday last, very early in the morning, his Imperial Majelly parted from hence on his journey to Paffam, to Celebrate his Marriage there, the Empress Dowager, the Queen of Spain, and the Archdurchefs of Austria remain, here, intending to go and meet their Imperial Majeffics a dayes journey in their recum hither. A Solemn Embafly is arrived on the Eronciers from the Port, where he will remain till the Emperor be come back to this place. From Confiantinopie there be Letters which advise the death of the Grand Vilier, which, it's thought, may occasion fome change in the affairs of that Court.

Copenhagen, Decemb. 1. Our Letters from Schonen give us now the particulars of the access made by the quedes upon Christianople, viz. that shay were between 3 and 4000 itrong, commanded in chiefby Count Pontus de la Gardie, and under him by the Sieur Qulevelt if that they had made two affaults upon Chriftianople, but were both times repulfed with the loss in all of 500 Men; upon which faccefs, the Boors in those parts had allemb'el rogether to the number of 6 or 7000 Men, and had befet the Sucdes, but that wanting Cavalry, of which the Enemy had a good Body, the Governor of Christianople had fent to the King of Denmark, who had the 29 past his Head-quarter at Schwenfrup, to pray him to fend them an allitance of 2000 Horfe, and in fuch cafe he doubted not but to give a good account of the Enemy, which his Majefty had according'y.commanded thither, fo that we impariently ex-pect to know the issue, Yesterday and this day there has been a report, as if the Sucdes Army were marching back to Heimfladt, which we shall be glad to hear confirmed, for that our Army is almost ruined by the sweather. We cannot yet learn the caufe of the Duke of Halleins having quired the Kings fervices at a time when there may be formuch need of a General of his Courage and Conduct.
