Rainbonne, Dicemb. 3. Irom Neubourg we have an account, that yesterday the Imperial Bride fet out trom thence, taking h r journey through the Territories of the Elector of Bavaria. I hat Elector will no be present at the Celebration of the Marriage at Passaw, as fe me have reported, but will fend an Envoy thicker, to Complement their Imperial Majetties. The 28 past, the Emperor arrived at Linty, having made his journey rehither from Vienna in fix dayes. The Prince Adolphus of Denaponi, hath by Letter to the States of he Empire affembled here, prayed their good offices in behalf of himfelf, and the Duke of Deuxponis, as there may be occasi n. The States of the Circle of Franconia make great Complaints of the oppressions they lie under, by being obliged to furnish Winter quarters to the Imperial Froops, to the ruine of their Countries.

Strasburgh, Decemb. 4. The Electoral Prince of Saxony continues still here, being somewhat indisposed. All the places in Alfase are crowded with Soldiers; so that the poor people in many places for sake their houses and habitations; for that there is no room for them.

Cologne, Decemb. 8. Contrary to the general exipectation) and indeed his Excellencies own intention, the Count Kinshi, the Emperors Ambaffador continues still there joccasioned by a light indisposition. We' do not yet know when his Highness may be expected back from Zealand, our last Letters from thence telling us, that his Highness found his presence would be necessary there for some short time longer. The News we had of the arrival of the Count of Kinski, the Imperial Plenipotentiary, ar Eleves proves a mistake, for the Letters we receive of the 8th Inflant from Cologne, tell us, that his Excellency was still there, occasioned by an indisposition, which

took him the day before he intended to depart thence. Bruffels, Dicemb. 11.
