BARRINGTON.

Constantinople, January 4. The Christians in the Crimea are fled to the Russians, and the Empréss has given Orders to build a large Town for their Reception, between Kerch and Janicale. Duclett Gherci, with the Turkish Troops, is still at Caffa; and there are five thousand Russian Troops within the Peninsula, and two thousand without, waiting to take Possession of Kinburn Brigadier Boronzoff is to sail for Paros the latter End of next Week, having compleated his Purchase of Bread and Flour for the Fleet.

Constantinople, January 4. The Hospodar of Wallachia is set out for his Principality; but the Ambassador of the Port to the Court of Petersburg has not yet begun his Journey for that City; and Marshal Romanzow is still in Moldavia.

Florence, January 31. A few Days ago Rear Admiral Babal arrived at Porto Ferrajo with Three Russian Ships of the Line, which are to be repaired in that Port.
