## From Tuesday March 14, to Saturday March 18, 1775.

Conflantinople, February 3. BDUL Kerim, Ambaffador from this Court to that of Petersburg, took Leave Yesterday, and will fet out in a few Days : as he takes fifty Days to travel to Chotzim, Prince Repnin is not expected here till the latter End of May.

The Ratifications of the Treaty of Peace which were brought by Major Buck were exchanged at the Porte on the 24th past; on which Occasion Colonel Peterson was received with uncommon Honours. Hc, and his Secretary, had each a Pelice of Sable; Major Buck a Pelice of Ermine; and the Ruffian Drugoman, Mr. Pifani, one of Petit Gris; all their Attendants had Caftans.

On Tuesday Major Buck set out, with the Ratifications of the Peace, on his Return to the Head Quarters of the Ruflian Army at Mochilow; and in cafe Marshal Romanzow should be gone from thence, he is to follow him to Molcow.

The Court of Petersburg has confented to the Grand Signor's fending the Investiture of the Sword and Aigrette, as Caliph, to the Han of the Tartars, who is notwithstanding to be entirely independent in his Temporal Concerns. The Sultan has conferred the Titles of Prince of Moldavia and Cabi net Councillor on the Drugoman of the Porte, who attended the Reis Effendi in this Negotiation.

A large Caravan from Bagdat, confilting of fifteen hundred laden Camels, going to Damafcus, was plundered near Palmyra by Sheck Tyawr, Chief of the Amizy Arabs: Six hundred Perfians, who accompanied it, going to Mecca, were likewife ftripped ; amongft whom were fome Perfons of Distinction. It is faid, two hundred Perfons died of the Cold after the Caravan was plundered. The Lofs of this Caravan is faid to be very great, and falls heavy on the Merchants of Bagdat, Buffora, Damafcus, Aleppo, and Conftantinople. Kherim Khan has assumed the Title of Sophi of

Persia; and the Grand Signor has fent Vehbi Effendi to compliment him.

A Venetian Vessel of Three Hundred Tons, laden with Corn, was taken at Anchor under Silidrone hy the Pirates, who murdered the Crew and carried off the Veffel.

The Russian Frigate, which arrived here the 10th of November, is waiting for a fair Wind to fail for Paros: Brigadier Borozow and the reft of the Officers have taken Leave

Moscow, February 9. The whole Ruffian Army (except the Garrifons of Bender and Chotzim) has evacuated the Turkifh Dominions, and is actually in Poland; and this Court expects to hear, by the first Courier, of the Exchange of the Ratifications, and the Delivery up of Kinburn, in confequence of which their Troops will quit the two abovemen tioned Places. It is imagined that Marshal Romanzow will arrive here about the latter End of March.

Every Thing being prepared for Prince Repnin's Journey, it is believed it will take place foon after Count Panin's Arrival here, who is expected next Week.

Yesterday Evening there was a very numerous and brilliant Court, when most of the Nobility had the Honour of being presented to the Empress. Vienna, February 25. The Inundations of the

Danube, occafioned by the late fudden Thaw, have done very confiderable Damage to large Tracts of Land in the Plains of Hungary, near the Banks of that River.

Munich. March 5. The Prince of Tour and Taxis is fet out for Vienna, where he will be inveft-

ed with the Enfigns of the Order of the Golden Fleece.

Hague, March 9. Yefterday being the Anniver-fary of the Prince Stadtholder's Birth-day, when he entered into the 28th Year of his Age, his Serene Highnefs received the Compliments of the principal Nobility, Ministers of State, Foreign Ministers, the Members of the Colleges, and the Officers of the Army and Navy.

St. Jamei's, March 15. The King was this Day pleafed to confer the Ho-nour of Knighthood on Noah Thomas, Doctor of Phyfick, and one of His Majesty's Phyficians in Ordinary.

St. James's, March 18.
