An Act to amend an Act made in the Eleventh Year of His pref nt Majesty's Reign, for improving and com-pleating the Navigation of the Rivers Thames and Isis, from the City of London, to the Town of Cricklade, in the County of Wills.

An Act for inlarging the Term and Powers granted in an Act, made in the Third Year of His prefent Ma jesty's Reign, for repairing the Road from Newmarket, over Newmarket Heath, to the Turnpike Road leading to Sump Cross, in the Counties of Cambridge and Suf folk; for repairing the Road branching out of, and leading from, the aforesaid Road, near The Devil's Dit b, on Newmark & Heath, to join the present Turnpike Road which leads to Cambridge; and for repairing the Highway through the Town of Newmarket, to the print Tumpike R ad from thence to Therford.

### PROCLAMATION,

THE States General of the United Provinces, To all who shall see, or hear these Presents read, Greeting :

Be it known, that We, for particular Reasons Us thereunto moving, have thought fit absolutely to prohibit, and We hereby absolutely do prohibit, all Exportation of Ammunition, Gunpowder, Guns, and Shot, by Ships belonging to the Dominions of Great Britain, provisionally for the Ferm of Six Months, upon Pain not only of Confication of the Arms and Ammunition which shall be found there on Board, but also of a Fine of a Thousand Guilders over and above, at the Charge of the Commander, whose Ship shall be answerable and liable to Execution for the f me.

That We have further thought fit to enact, and We do hereby enact, that during the abovefaid Term of Six Months, no Gunpowder, Guns, Shot, or other Instruments of War, shall be embarked on Board any other Ships, whether Foreign or belong-ing to this Country, to be transported Abroad, without Confent or Permission of the College of Admiralty under whose Jurisdiction the Embarkation shall be made upon Pain of Confiscation of the Arms, Gunpowder, Guns, Shot, or other Ammunition, which shall have been embarked without Permission, and of the Commander's incurring a

Fine of a Thousand Guilders, on Board of whose Ship the faid Arms and Ammunition shall have been embarked, and his Ship be answerable and liable to Execution for the faid Fine.

And, that no one may pretend Ignorance hereof, We call upon and require the States, the Hereditury Stadtholder, the Committee of Council, and the Deputations of the States, of the respective Provinces, and all other the Officers and Justices of these Countries, to cause this Our Proclamation to be forthwith promulged, published, and affixed, in all Places where such Publication is wont to be made. And We do further charge and command the Counsellors of the Admiralty, the Advocates General, together with all Admirals, Vice-Admi-Obedience to this Our Proclamation, proceeding and causing to be proceeded against the Transgressors thereof, without Favour, Connivance, Dissimulation, or Composition.—For such have We found meet.
