Stral fundt, Nov. 30. The Count Coning mark General of the Spedish Forces in this Country having advice that the Elector of Brandenburg had put his Troops in Winter quarters on the Elbe and in the Dutchy of Bremen, except two Regiments of Horse and one of Foot which remained in the Neighborhood of Demmin, he parred hence the 18 inftune with a 1000 Horse, drawn out of the Isle of Rugen, and 400 Foot of this Garison, and advanced by Demgarten into Mecklenburg; upon the advance of our Troops the Enemy recired, and gave the Count Coning mach the berty to lay a Bridge over the River Requentis, which he cauled Major-General Grothaug to pals with 400 foot, with orders to poffes himfelf of Ribenits, a small place in the Dutchy of Mecklenburg, frituate about a quarter of a League from Pemgarien,, the Garison that was in Ribentis, consisting in 150, men, not finding them-felves able to make good the Post abandoned it, and the Suedes made themselves Matters of it without the least relistance. 1. The Officer that commanded in Tripree upon the advance of our Troops likewife quitted it, and retired; and the Count of Coningsmark being possessed. of these two Posts, which he hath since caused to be demolished, ordered notice to be given to the principal Inhabitants of the Dutchy of Mecklenburg, that they should repair to Tribenits to agree their Contributions, which they accordingly did, and agreed to pay 6000 Crowns per month. This done his Excellency resurned hither again the 22d.

Bromen, Decemb. 4.
