The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the 19th of October last, for prohibiting the Exporting out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwise, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the 19th Day of this that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer - His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy-Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Persons whatsoever (except the Master-General, Lieutenant General, or Principal Officers of the Ordnance, for His Majesty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid 19th Day of this Instant April, pre-fume to transport, into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition on Board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coastwise, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy-Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forseitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, entituled, "An Act to " impower His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Salt petre; and to inforce the law for im-" powering His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms and Am-" munition; and also to impower His Majesty to " restrain the carrying Coastwise of Salt petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammu-" nition." And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.
