Naples, Nov. 24. We have at prefent little to advife from hence, unlefs it be to tell you, that affairs in *sici*ly continue in an ill posture, infomuch that the Spanifs Viceroy has fent his Lady with most of his richest Move-

ables hither for their greater fecurity. Madrid, Dec. 2. The last Letters we had from Flanders, left people in expectation of receiving a fudden and confiderable fupply of monies from hence, in order to the making the necessary preparations against Spring, which might enable them to act feparately, without being obliged to the affiftance of their Allies; but at this Court the chief care feems to be for the prefervation of Sicily, and to that end for the ferring out a Fleet of our own against Spring, which may be able to make head against the French, this Crown being, as it's faid, little facisfied with the Dutch Squadron that was employed in We have advices from Argiers which fay, that Sicily. there hath been a perfon on the part of the States Ge-nerat of the United Provinces, to make a Peace with that Government, but that hitberto he had not fucceeded in his Negotiation, and therefore was preparing for his return home. From Libon they write, that the Corfairs of Barbary do very much infelt those Coasts, and disturb the Navigation of the Portuguese. The King, we are told, continues his intention of beginning his journey to Arragon about the middle of May, to give the States of that Kingdom the fatisfaction they by their Deputies prayed for, to have their priviledges confirmed and fworn to by his Majefty. It is faid that orders have been fent to the Prince de Ligne, Governor of Milan, to raife feveral Troops in that Countrey for the fervice of Sicily. The Count de Melgar, who is at present at Rome in quality of Ambaffador of this Crown, has orders to remain there with the fame character, until fuch time as the Marquis de Liche arrive there; and the Cardinal Nithard being mide Archbishop of Palermo, will go and live at his Diocefs. A Solemn Embafy is preparing to be fent to the Emperors Court, to conduct the young Queen of Spain into this Kingdom.

Copenhagen, Decemb. 8. Notwithflanding the violent colds, the Armies in Schonen continue in the field, posted as formerly, frequent actions happing between Parties, in which Prifoners are taken on both fides, Two dayes fince Admiral Tromp Landed with 2000 Seamen in Schonen, to reinforce the Danish Army, which is very much weakned through the diffempers occasioned by the Season, which notwithstanding it is extreme rigorous, the King is refolved to continue in the field till the Suedes are retired out of Schonen. nue, but without the least certainty. The King of Denmark has conferred upon the Sieur Tromp the Honour of an Earl of this Kingdom, and has likewife made him a Knight of the Order of the Elephane, Ditto, Decemb. 10, It feems the Suedifh Army did

The 6th inftant parted hence Count Anthony of Oldenburg on his way to Nimeguen, where he is to affift at the Treaty of Peace on the part of this Crown ; a great number of Coats, Shoes, and Stockings, with other Necessaries, are providing here for the Army in fome measure to fortifie the Soldiers against the extreme colds. The Sieur Guldenlieu is upon his return to Normay, to give the Enemy a diversion on that fide.

Ratibonne, Decemb. 7. The 5th inflant his Imperial Majelty parted from Linty on his journey to Paffam, whither the Bilhop of Aichftadt is gone from hence. The 6th inftant the Imperial Bride arrived at Staubingen, fix Germin miles from hence, and the 8th continu-The Duke and Dutchefs of ed her journey to Paffiw. Neuburg remain at their Refidence at Neuburg. In Bobemia great Levies are making for the fervice of the Emperor.

Strasburg, Dec. 12. The Troops being now quiet in their Winter-quarters, there happens nothing worth

communicating in these parts. Francfors, Decemb. 13. There hath been much to do. about getting Winter-quarters for the Munfter and Lunenburgh Troops, in which to many difficulties have occurred, that had not the faid Troops by force poffeffed themfelves of feveral places convenient for them, they would have been still to feek for quarters. The Officers come daily hither, and buy what necessaries they need. The Town of Gelhaufen hach confented to receive feven Troops of Horfe, but the Lunenburght not being content therewith, they have drawn their Foices together, and have hefet the faid place, with defign to enter it by force.

Cologne, Decemb. 15. On Thurflay last arrived here another Courier from the Emperors Court at Paffama with orders to the O[nabrug Troops forthwith to quit this Diocefs, which Courier was directed by the principal Commanders of the find Troops to pais on to Ofse-brug, where their Duke at prefent is, without whole orders they refule to yield obedience to thole of the Emperor, \_The Imperial Commiffary, the Sieur Fudocus, prefies the demand he hath made to our Magistrates of the Sum of foodo Crowns, to exempt them from giving Winter quarters; but the faid Sum being to be raifed from the Commonalty, it's thought it will prove a matter of fome difficulty. The other day hapned a. great diforder at Dorften in this Diocefs, by reason that the Imperial Garifon that is there, affifted by the Inhabitants, and the Boors of the Neighborhood, refused the to follow in a day or two ; and these reports still conti- i to revenge which, we understand, that part of the Garifon

fon of Wefel, and 4 or 900 men from Lipftadt, are on their march to join the faid Regiment, which lies at prefent near Marte in the Countrey of Recklinebuy fen, and to fecond it, in making fome attempt upon Dorften, which may be of very ill confequence. Here has been a report for fome dayes in Town, of an appearance of the Imperialifis quitting Bonne very fuddenly, and that our Elector will go and refide there.

Hague, Decemb. 15. On Sunday last his Highness the Prince of Orange returned hither from Zealand, having adjusted matters there wholly to his facisfaction, and as the good and quiet of that Province required. For the States having conferred on his Highnels as their Stadtholder, full power and authority to do as he fhould fee caufe for the removing the diforders occasioned by the Election of Dr. Momma into the Ministry of Middleburg ; this Highnel's gave order for the removing the faid Dr. Momina, and another Minifter, who, it feems, had misbehaved filmsfelf in this occasion, as likewife for the difplacing a Burghermaster, three Schepenen, and as many Raedisheeren or Counfellors, together with ten Gaptains, and feveral other inferior Officers of the Militia of the City of Middleburg, their respective plaees being supplied with others appointed by his Highnefs; all which was accordingly punctually executed. The States of Holland have abfolutely confented to the flate of the War for the next year, fo that the Recruits are now going to be taken in hand, and we are told that Commissions are preparing for the raising two new Regiments of Dragoons. From Nimeguen they write, that Don Pedro de Ronquillo, Ambaffador and Plenipotentiary of Spain, was arrived there. The Squadron of Men of War under the command of the Sieur Allemonde, which was in the Spanish service in Sicily, is and rived, four or five of them being got in the rexel, the others endeavoured to put into the Maefe, but were hindred by the Ice, fo that it's thought they are gone for Schenevelt on the Coaft of Zealand. From Flanders our Letters rell us, that the French have had a defign to furprize Valenciennes, by means of fome inrelligence they had within the Town ; that accordingly they had brought a great number of Troops into the Neighborhood of that City, but that the defign had been

in time difcovered by the Spaniards. Disto, Decemb. 18. Yefterday in the afternoon arrived here the Count Waldeck from his Effate at Cuylenburg. Upon the advice that came from Flanders, that the French were drawing their Forces together, in order to fome enterprize of importance, orders were given to the Cavalry of this State which was quartered in Brabant, forthwith to march to affift the Spaniards ; but those fears being over, the faid Troops are, we hear, returned to their quarters. The States of Holland will, it's thought, feparate in a day or two, the chief matter at prefent before them for these dayes paft, being to raife the monies neceffary for the defraying the charges of the next Campagne. We have the certainty of the arrival of the Spanish Plate Fleet at St Lucar.

Bruffels, Decemb. 13. Yefterday in the afternoon marthed from hence the whole Garifon of this City, confifting in 2000 Horfe, and fonte Foot and Dragoons, towards Valenciennes, upon advice that came from thence, that the French had an enterprize in hand upon that City, in which they were, as it's faid, to have been affifted by fome perfons within the place; but the fame having been timely difcovered, the Lemenies defign was prevented. The French Patries come frequently very near to this place, fo that the wayes are unfafe for

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Travellers. This day we have news here, that the French have an eye upon St Giflain, especially if the Frost continue.

Ditto, Decemb. 22. The Most Christian King has fent orders to all the Governors of his places in Flanders, not to require any Contributions of the Spanish Inhabitants, and on the other fide not to permit his Subjects to pay any ; and that in cafe our Troops proceed to exccution, that they in return deftroy all the Villages and places in the diffrict of the Governor who caufes the execution to be made. We are told that the Marefchal de Grequi's Troops are marching from Lorrain towards thefe Countries. The French have put ftrong Garifons into Mabenge and Banay, which places they fortifie; and Cambray and Valenciennes are at prefent fo blocked up, that there is no getting into them without Palsports from the French. At Valenciennes the Governor has formed two Regiments of the pooreft of the Inhabitants, who wanting other employment, will receive fome maintenance that way, and by this means they will not be only keptquiet, but the Garison will be likewife reinforced, We apprehend the Enemy will attempt fome of our places during this hard Froft.

Falmouth, Dec. 7. About the beginning of the laft month put in here a small Vessel, Frigat built, called the Endeavor of London, of about 30 Tuns, William Gillingham Master, Laden at Amsterdam in September laft, and bound for Nantes in France with Pepper marked C. H. and Viaz marked G. P.
