**W**Hereas I have been informed, that it is the general Opinion of the Gentlemen and Freeholders of the County of Nottingham that the Militia should be raised within the same; and whereas, by an Act of Parliament of the Ninth Year of His present Majesty, it is directed, That, in all Counties where the Militia has not been raised, His Majesty's Lieutenant for every such County, with any two or more Deputy-Lieutenants, or, on the Removal, or in the Absence, of His Majesty's Lieutenant, any three or more Deputy-Lieutenants, shall meet, at some City or Principal Town of the County or Place for which they shall be commissioned, on the second Tuesday in March in every Year: And whereas such Meeting was this Year duly advertised, and only one Deputy-Lieutenant attended the same: As I shall always think myself happy in contributing to the utmost of my Power to any Thing that will be agreeable to the County in general, I do hereby appoint a General Meeting to be held at the Swan Inn in Mansfield in the said County of Nottingham, on Tuesday the Thirtieth Day of June next, at Ten o'Clock in the Forenoon; and I hope the Deputy-Lieutenants, and other Gentlemen of the County, will be so obliging as to attend there on that Day, and use their utmost Endeavours to put the Militia Laws into Execution.

**T**HE Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty being informed, that, notwithstanding His Majesty's Pleasure signified to His Consuls residing in Foreign Parts, several Masters of Ships and Vessels belonging to His Majesty's Subjects, which have come into the Ports where they the said Consuls reside, have upon their Demand refused to produce to them the Passes which they have received, in order to their endorsing the same in the Manner they are required to do: Their Lordships do therefore give Notice, that it is expected all such Masters of Ships or Vessels coming into any Port where there is any such Consul, do, at their Peril, strictly comply

with His Majesty's Pleasure, by producing to them the Passes in their Possession; and that when any Ship or Vessel belonging to His Majesty's Subjects shall be sold at any Port abroad, where a British Minister or Consul doth reside, their Masters do deliver to such Minister or Consul their Pass; or, if no such Minister or Consul, transmit them, as soon as possibly they can, to this Office, in order to their being cancelled, that they may not, to the Prejudice of the Trade of His Majesty's Subjects, fall into the Hands of Foreigners; otherwise their Bonds will be put in Suit with the utmost Severity of the Law. And their Lordships do hereby give Notice to all Masters of Ships or Vessels belonging to His Majesty's Subjects, who may receive Passes either from this Office, or from any of the Governors of His Majesty's Foreign Islands or Plantations, that, by an Act passed in the Fourth Year of His late Majesty, it is made Felony, without Benefit of the Clergy, if any Erasure or Alteration whatever shall be found made in such Passes.
