

And their Lordships do bareby give Notice to all Masters of Ships or Vessels belonging to His Ma-jesty's Subjects, who may receive Passes either from this Office, or from any of the Governors of His Majefly's Foreign Islands or Plantations, that, by an Act paffed in the Fourth Year of His late Majefly, it is made Fe-lony, without Benefit of the Clergy, if any Erafement or Alteration whatever shall be found made in fuch Paffes.
