Moscow, April 17. N. S. Cadix, April 25. An Order has been sent to the Health-Office here, to put all Vessels, coming from any of the Ports of Portugal, under a long Quarantine, on account of a contagious Distemper which has broken out in a small Town on the Coast, about

four Leagues to the Northward of the Rock of Lisbon, called Ericora, and has been fatal to many of the Inhabitants, and had also reached some of the neighbouring Villages.

Aranjuez, May 1. Her Royal Highness the Princess, and the Infanta, are perfectly well; and his Catholick Majesty proposes going to Cuerva on the 10th of this Month.

Dresden, May 10. On Monday last the Electoral Court of Saxony removed to Pillnitz, on the Elbe: Their Electoral Highnesses, with Prince Anthony and Prince Maximilian, are to remain there during the Summer.

This being her Serene Highness the Reigning Electress of Saxony's Birth-day, it is celebrated at Pillnitz, and great Gala is to be observed at Dresden.
