Hague, May 6. H IS late Majefly having been gracioufly pleafed, by bis Warrant under bis Royal Sign Manual, dated the 10th Day of June, 1733, to cftablifb certain Rules and Orders for the Relief of Poor Widows of Commiffion and Warrant Officers of the Royal Navy: Thefe are to give Notice, that Copies of the faid Rules and Or-ders are lodged with the Commiffioners of His Majefly's Navy at Chatham, Portfmouth, and Plymouth; as alfo with the Clerks of the Checque at Deptford, Woolwich, and Sheërnefs'; and with the Naval-Offi-cers at Harwich, Deal, and Kinfale; where all fuch Widows as intend to lay in their Claims, may be in-Widows as intend to lay in their Claims, may be in-formed of all Particulars which entitle them' to the Benefit of the faid Charity, and receive the proper Certificates for, that Purpole. But fuch Widows as live at too great a Diffance from the Places abovementioned, may apply by Letter to Mr. Bellon; at the Admiralty-Office, who will fend them all neceffary Information. And the Governors of the faid Charity intending to distribute to the Widows of Sea-Officers who died before the 30th of August, 1732, as well as to the Widows of those who died fince that Time, whose Circumstances come within the Rules of the Establishment, such Monies as may be due to them on the 31st of May instant; This is to give Notice, that any Widows who have not yet applied, and intend to lay in their Claims, may do fo as join as possible; and that all fuch Widows, whose Claims have been already allowed, may fend or bring to this Office, as foon as poffible, the Affidavits required by the Rules, in order to their being continued upon the Pension or Bounty.
