Lisbon, May 13.

**H**IS Most Faithful Majesty and the Royal Family returned from Salvaterra on Monday last. Monif. de Sa, Secretary of State, has given Publick Notice, that during the Illness of Don Luis da Cunha he has Orders to act in the Foreign and Military Department.

*Venice, June 2.* The Emperor arrived here on Saturday May the 20th, and nearly at the same Time his Brothers, the Grand Duke of Tuscany and the Archdukes Ferdinand and Maximilian.

His Imperial Majesty left this Place on the 29th past, as did likewise the Grand Duke of Tuscany, and the two Archdukes.

*Munich, June 8.* The Elector Palatine was thought to be in great Danger during several Days last Week, from an inflammatory Fever, but Accounts received yesterday say, that he is now in a fair Way of Recovery.

*Ile of Wight, June 9.* Captain Riddell, of the Belborough, gives an Account, that on the 24th of March last, whilst he was at St. Helena, The British King arrived at that Island from Bengal with Advice, that General Clavering, the Judges, and Council, were safely arrived at Bengal.
