Moscow, May 18.

AT the Solicitation of the Inhabitants of the new acquired Province of White Russia, to have their Taxes put upon the same Footing on which they were before it came under the Dominion of this Empire, her Imperial Majesty has been graciously pleased to reduce their Taxes still lower, by taking off one Half of what they were rated at.

On Saturday last we had a heavier Fall of Snow than has ever been known here at this Season of the Year: It continued four and twenty Hours incessantly. The Coldness of the Weather, however, has not prevented the greatest Part of the Nobility from retiring to their Country Seats from this Capital. The excessive Price of all Sorts of Provisions, which has risen to a Degree hitherto unheard of in this Country, is supposed to have contributed to induce the Nobility to leave the Capital thus early.

Stockholm, June 6. By Letters from Abo of the 30th inst, we learn, that his Swedish Majesty had been detained there by two slight Attacks of a Fever, but intended to proceed on the 31st to Helsingfors, making small Days Journies on account of the Badness of the Roads, and in order to give the Inhabitants an Opportunity of paying their Duty to his Majesty.

Berlin, June 10. His Prussian Majesty arrived at Custrin on Friday the 2d Instant towards Noon; and is expected at Potsdam on Monday next.

Hamburg, June 13. In the Assembly of the Senate here came on Yesterday the Election of a new Senator, which fell on the Person of Mr. Joachim Caspar Voigt, an opulent Merchant of this City, in the Room of Senator Krohn, who died the 5th Instant.

Paris, June 14. By Letters from Rheims we are informed, that on the 11th Instant, the Day appointed for the Coronation of his most Christian Majesty, the Places in the Cathedral were filled by Six o'Clock in the Morning; and at Seven his Majesty appeared, when the Ceremony began, which was performed by the Cardinal de la Rocheaymon, and ended a little before One; the whole having been conducted with the greatest Magnificence and Regularity.

His most Christian Majesty is expected at Versailles on Monday the 19th Instant.
