T the Sollicitation of the Inhabitants of the new acquired Province of White Russia, to have their Taxes put upon the same Footing on which they were before it came under the Dominion of this Empire, her Imperial Majesty has been graciously pleased to reduce their Taxes still lower, by taking off one Half of what they were rated at.

On Saturday last we had a heavier Fall of Snow than has ever been known here at this Season of the Year: It continued four and twenty Hours inceffantly. The Coldness of the Weather, however, has not prevented the greatest Part of the Nobility from retiring to their Country Seats from this Capital. The excessive Price of all Sorts of Provisions, which has risen to a Degree hitherto unheard of in this Country, is supposed to have contributed to in-duce the Nobility to leave the Capital thus early.

Stockbolm, June 6. By Letters from Abo of the 30th past, we learn, that his Swedish Majesty had been detained there by two slight Attacks of a Fever, but intended to proceed on the 31st to Helfingfors, making small Days Journies on account of the Badness of the Roads, and in order to give the Inhabitants an Opportunity of paying their Duty to his Majesty.
