Moscow, May 18. T the Sollicitation of the Inhabitants of the new acquired Province of White Ruffia, to have their Taxes put upon the fame Footing on which they were before it came under the Dominion of this Empire, her Imperial Majetty has been gracioufly pleated to reduce their Taxes still lower, by taking off one Half of what they were rated at.

On Saturday last we had a heavier Fall of Snow than has ever been known here at this Seafon of the Year: It continued four and twenty Hours incef-fantly. The Coldness of the Weather, however, has not prevented the greatest Part of the Nobility from retiring to their Country Seats from this Ca-pital. The excessive Price of all Sorts of Provisions, which has rifen to a Degree hitherto unheard of in this Country, is supposed to have contributed to in-duce the Nobility to leave the Capital thus early.

Stockbolm, June 6. By Letters from Abo of the 30th paft, we learn, that his Swedish Majesty had been detained there by two slight Attacks of a Fever, but intended to proceed on the 31ft to Helfingfors, making fmall Days Journies on account of the Badness of the Roads, and in order to give the Inhabitants an Opportunity of paying their Duty to his Majesty.

Berlin, June 10. His Prullian Majefty arrived at Cuftrin on Friday the 2d Inftant towards Noon ; and is expected at Potzdam on Monday next.

Hamburgh, June 13. In the Affembly of the Se-nate here came on Yesterday the Election of a new Senator, which fell on the Person of Mr. Joachim Caf-par Voigt, an opulent Merchant of this City, in the Room of Senator Krohn, who died the 5th Instant.

Paris, June 14. By Letters from Rheims we are informed, that on the 11th Instant, the Day appointed for the Coronation of his most Christian Majesty, the Places in the Cathedral were filled by Six o'Clock in the Morning; and at Seven his Ma-jefty appeared, when the Ceremony began, which was performed by the Cardinal de la Rocheaymon, and ended a little before One; the whole having been conducted with the greatest Magnificence and Regularity.

His most Christian Majesty is expected at Versailles on Monday the 19th Inftant.
