St. James's, June 24.

THURSDAY last, being observed as the Anniversary of His Majesty's Birth-Day, there was a very numerous and splendid Appearance of the Nobility, Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Distinction, to compliment His Majesty on the Occasion. At Noon the Guns in the Park, and at the Tower, were fired; and in the Evening there was a Ball at Court, and Illuminations, and other Publick Demonstrations of Joy, throughout London and Westminster.

The King has been pleased to grant unto James Ivers, of Addington Place in the County of Surry, Esq; and his Issue, his Royal Leave and Licence to take and use the Surname of Trecothick only, and bear the Arms of Trecothick, the same being first duly exemplified and registered, according to the Laws of Arms, in the Heralds Office; and also to order, that this His Majesty's Concession and Declaration be registered in His Majesty's College of Arms.

The King has been pleased to order Letters Patent to be passed under the Great Seal of the Kingdom of Ireland, for constituting one Body Politick and Corporate, by the Name of the Hibernian Marine Society in Dublin, for maintaining, educating, and apprenticing the Orphans and Children of decayed Seamen in His Majesty's Royal Navy, and Merchants Service.
