Fort William, November 30, 1774.

THE Anson and Ashburnham came to Anchor in this River on the 14th of last Month; and, on the 19th following, General Clavering, the Judges, and Council, landed at Calcutta, where they were received with the greatest Marks of Respect, and Attention.

Florence, June 10 The Emperor, and the Great Duke, arrived here early on Saturday Morning the 1st Instant, and proceeded directly to a Villa near this City.

Paris, June 21. The Disorder among the horned Cattle, which was thought to be at an End, made it's Appearance again lately in a Village in the Diocese of Touloufe: Five or Six died of it; and the Archbishop immediately ordered all the infected Cattle to be killed, and paid the Owners the Value of them; by which Step he has prevented the Infection from spreading any farther.

*W*HEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, That, on Friday Night last, the 23d Instant, the Dwelling-House of Samuel Robinson, near Pelican Stairs, in the Parish of St. Paul Shadwell in the County of Middlesex, Lighterman, was burglariously broken open, and robbed of Money, a Bank Note, and several other Things of Value, by two or more Persons; and that the said House was afterwards wickedly and maliciously set on Fire, (by the said Persons, as there is great Reason to believe) and burnt down, the said Samuel Robinson, his Wife and Children, narrowly escaping with their Lives, without being able to save any Part of their Property: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in committing the said Burglary and Felony, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person who actually set Fire to the said House) who shall discover his or her Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they, may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And that the said Mr. Durnford believes the said Letter was written and stuck up by some malicious Person, on Account only of his having done his Duty as Surveyor of the Highways, according to the Direction of the Statute in that Case lately made and provided:

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Person or Persons concerned in writing or sticking up the said Letter, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any of them (except the Person who actually wrote the said Letter, who, all discover his or her Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they, may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
