Lisbon, June 9.

**T**HE 6th Instant (being his most Faithful Majesty's Birth-day) was celebrated here with great Marks of Respect. The magnificent Equestrian Statue of his Majesty, lately erected in the new grand Square, called the Praça do Commercio, which had hitherto been covered, was made publick with great Ceremony: The Tribunals, the Senate, the Junta do Commercio, the Grandees, Principal Nobility, and Great Officers of State, attended; four Regiments of Infantry, and two of Cavalry, were drawn up in the Square.

The Festival lasted three Days; every Evening concluding with Fireworks and Illuminations. Their most Faithful Majesties and all the Royal Family were present each Day at the Ceremonies in the Praça do Commercio. The whole was conducted with great Magnificence and Order.

His most Faithful Majesty was pleased to make several Military Promotions on this Occasion.

Lisbon, June 10. Dom Luis da Cunha, Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, died a few Days ago.

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Person or Persons concerned in writing or sticking up the said Letter, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any of them, (except the Person who actually wrote the said Letter) who shall discover his or her Accomplice or Accomplice therein, so that he, she, or they, may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
