Whiteball, July 18, 1775. IEUTENANT-General Gage, in his Letters to the Earl of Dartmouth, dated June 12, 1775, gives an Account, That the Town of Bolton continued to be furrounded by a large Body of Rebel Provincials, and that all Communication with the Country was cut off; that the Rebels had been burning Houses, and driving Sheep off an Island that has eafy Communication with the main Land, which drew on a Skirmish with some Marines, who drove the Rebels away ; but that an armed Schooner, 6that had been fent between the Island and the main Land, having got on Shore at High Water, there was no Poffibility of faving her, for, as the Tide fell, fhe was left quite dry, and burned by the Rebels. - Two Men were killed, and a few wounded.

The first Embarkation of Troops from Ireland, confifting of three Regiments of Infantry and one of Light Cavalry, was arrived at Bofton ; and General Gage had published a Proclamation, offering His Majefty's Pardon to all Perfons who fhould immediately lay down their Arms, (except Samuel Adams and John Hancock) declaring all Perfons to be Traitors, who fhould aid and affift, or hold any Correspondence with, the Rebels; and ordering Martial Law to be in Force within the Province of Maffachusets Bay, so long as the prefent unhappy Occasion shall necessarily reguire it.

Naples, June 27. The Harvest in Sicily has been hitherto remarkably good; and we hear it is likely to prove the fame throughout these King-doms. There is likewise every Appearance of Abundance of Silk and Oil.

Florence, June 27. The Emperor left this Place at Eleven o'Clock last Night, on his Return to Vi-enna. His Imperial Majetty, during his Stay here. observed the strictest Incognito, but was prefent at the feveral Publick Processions which are usual at this Seafon of the Year.

Madrid, June 29. By the last Advices from Car-thagena we learn; that the Fleet sailed from thence on the 23d Instant; but, about three Leagues from Land, was prevented from purfuing it's Course by a firong Easterly Wind, and remained on the 24th at the lame Diftance from the Coaft.
