Qure will not admit of it, for that there is a neceffity to provice Winter-quarters for cheTroops thac have ferved this Summer. The Deputy of the Elector of Suxony has, as we ate informed, declared that his Mattef is refolved by no means to luffer any Troups to enter upon his Territories, and chat it any force be ufed, he will oppofe furee, to which end the ouner Princes of the Houfe of saxony have refolved oo juin whar furce theycan make with chat: of the Elettor; the faid Minilter alding, that if any ill confequences be produced the eby, they oushe not to be impu.eit to his Electural Histrnels his Matter, bar to thofe that are the firt caufers or them. This Deer hath again writena vary carnclt Letter to the suiffe Cinions, to defiruthen not to permit in their Territoriesany Levies or Recruits to be made for the fervice of Frante. From Vicnna they write, Thar greatelt part of the City of Ocdemb.erg, wheie the Proteltants were permitted the free exercife of their Religion, was by an accidental Fire burac down to the ground in the fpace of few hours. The Imperial Troops that were in Pomerania this Campagne, are to wincer in Silcfia.

Francfort, Dacemb. 17. We have Leprers from Ratisbonne which advife, that the Elector of Bavsria had perfonally affitted ar the Celebration of the Emperors Marriage at $P_{\text {a }} \iint$ ato, from whence we expect the particulats of that Ceremony, and to know the certainty of the faid advice from R.uisbonme, which is here doubred by ma 4. Our Magitrates have not as yet been able oo r. ve concerning the furnifhing the Sum of Money derian 'cd by the Lunenburg Troops, which they ftill wath great earneftuef, prefs for. The French Garifon in Deux-ponts very much incommodes the Neighbouring Countries by irs incurfions, to be freed from which, the Countrey people are very willing to pay the Contributions demanded by them.

Cologne, Decemb. 18. The Imperial Plenipotentiary the Counc $K$ insk $i$ is now precty well recovered, however he will not pare hence for Nimeguen till after the Holidayes. The Bifhop of Ofnibrug has, as we are informed, made an anfwer to the Emperors late orders concerning bis withdrawing his Troops out of this Diocefs, in which he fayes, that he can by no means yield to them, without expofing his Troops to utter ruine, for that in the Diocels of Liege whither they are ordered to remove, they fhould lie open to the Garifons of Limburg and Macfiricht, not having there any ftrong place to fecurethemfelves in. The Brandenburgs feem to have quitced the defign they had of entring into the Coun-- trey of Recklinghufen.

Liege, Decemb. 18. The great News here is (of which however we cannot give you any certainty) that the Imperialifts will draw their Troops out of Bonne, and that a Garifon of the Duke of Newburgs Troops will be put into that City. The Sieur de Pailleroles is arrived bere, with the quality of Refident of the moft Chriftian King, and has had Audience of our Senate. The Garifons of Namur, Cbarlemont and Ruremond, exact grear Impofitions of the Neighbquring Councries, to the utter ruine of the poatrinhabients, who, as well as many thoulauds moreghtiate coufyual Prayers for a Peace which may delivet thes artom the calamities and miferies which this War has btognght upon them.

Brufels, Decerbb. 22. Until the monies which we expeat from Spain arrive, we cannot begin the Recruits and ne.s Leyles intended azainft the next Campagne, nor can we "farisfie the Arrears of the Subfidies due to fome of our Alties, which will, we fear, make them likewife very backward in their preparations for the Campagne. We do not yet hear that our Governor General has taken any refolucion in the matter of the

Contributions, which the French will neither pay nor demstad. Ouradvices from all hinds continue to affure us, that the Erench not only intend to open the Campagne in thefe parts very early in the Spring, but likewile that they wi.l have very powerful Armies, for the Troops that were in Lorrain under the command of the Marefchal Crequi, are faid to be marching this way.Notwichltanding the Emperors orders to the Ofnabrug Trouts, chey Itill continue in the Diucefs of Cologne; and in the mean time chat Duke has fent to the Emperors Court, to reprefent to his Imperial Majelly the grear inconveniences that willattend his remuving his $T_{r o o p s}$ out of that Cuuntrey. Our laft Spanifh Letters did affure us, that orders had beengiven out tor the equipping 25 Men of War to be employed for the defence of Sictly the next Summer.

Marfeilles, Decemb. 14. At Tboulhn are arrived 24 Men of War from Meflifu, one having been driven athore by bad weather near C.vita Vecchin, was loft, but ber Cannon laved, and here are come in 10 Galles, fo that there are remaining at Me $\iint \ln _{1} \mathrm{t}_{4}$ Gallies, and 7 Men of War; thofe that are arrived at Tbuz on, are to be refited, and to retwin in the Spring wich a freflifuccor to Sictl).

Paits, Decemil. 26 The States of Langucatoc have confented to the demand of three Millions made by the Kıng, to be employed fur the con:iouing the work of the Canal, in order to the joining the Medicerranean and the Ocean. We are told that the Duke d'cnguten will part thence in few dayes, to go and hold the states of Buiguady. Here is at prefent much difcourfe of the Marriage of the Dauphin with the Princefs of -Emenarid. The 24 1nftant, the Sieur de Hansefcuile, Ambaffrdor of Maliba, performed the Ceremony of invefting the Che'walier d' lbeuf with the habit of chat order. From Alface our Lecters tell us, that the Sieur Monclar caufed great Magazines to be provided at Saverne; and that the Soldiers and others worked with preat diligence on the Fortifications of Schleftadt, Cotwner, and other places. Our Troops likewife fortific Monbeithurd.

Falmuzib, Decimb, 18. Yefterday came into this Port the Unicarn of Lindon, Captain Packe Commander, from Bantam in the Eaff Indies. The fame day arrived likewife the Lawprel of Inndun, Captain Gufe Commander, from the wift Indies, laden with Tobacces and bound for Amflerdam.

Lordon, Decemb. 22. We have this day Letrers from Deale, dated yefterday, which fay that a Veffel was arrived there from the Soundt, and thar the Mafter reported, that the $S_{\text {uedes }}$ and Danfb Army in Scronen had been engaged in a Eattel, and that the former had obtained a great Vi\&ory, of which be related feveral particulars, which we pmit here, for that we know not what credic ought to be given to them, till our Foreign Letters arrive from Holland or Fhinders, from whence are now wanting four Mails.
