Whitehall, July 25 1775. HIS Morning arrived Captain Chadds, of his Majesty's Ship Cerberus, with the following Letter, from the Ho-nourable Lieutenant-General Gage to the Earl of Dartmouth, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

> Copy of a Letter from the Honourable Lieutenant General Gage to the Earl of Darimouth. Dated Boston, June 25, 1775.

My Lord,

Am to acquaint your Lordship of an Action that happ ned on the 17th instant between His Majesty's roops and a large Body of the Rebel

An Alarm was given at Break of Day, on the 17th Instant, by a Firing from the Lively Ship of War; and Advice was soon afterwards received, that the Rebels had broke Ground, and were raising a Battery, on the Heights of the Peninsula of Charles-Town, against the Town of Boston. They were plainly feen at Work, and, in a few Hours, a Battery of Six Guns played upon their Works. parations were inflantly made for landing a Body of Men to drive them off, and Ten Companies of the Grenadiers, Ten of Light Infantry, with the 5th, 38th, 43d, and 52d, Battalions, with a Proportion of Field Artillery, under the Command of Major-General Howe and Brigadier-General Pigot, were embarked with great Expedition, and landed on the Peninfula without Opposition, under the Protection of some Ships of War, armed Vessels, and Boats, by whose Fire the Rebels were kept within their

Works.

The Troops formed as foon as landed; the Light Infantry posted on the Right, and the Grenadiers upon their Lest. The 5th and 38th Battalions drew up in the Rear of those Corps, and the 43d and 52d Battalions made a Third Line. The Rebels upon the Heighths were perceived to be in great Force, and ftrongly posted. A Redoubt, thrown up on the 16th at Night, with other Works, full of Men, defended with Cannon, and a large Body posted in the Houses in Charles-Town, covered their Right Flank; and their Center and Left were covered by a Breast-Work, Part of it Cannon-proof, which reached from the Left of the Redoubt to the Mystick or Medford River.

This Appearance of the Rebels Strength, and the large Columns feen pouring in to their Affistance, occasioned an Application for the Troops to be reinforced with some Companies of Light Infantry and Grenadiers, the 47th Battalion,

and the 1st Battalion of Marines; the Whole when in Conjunction, making a Body of something above 2000 Men. These Troops advanced, formed in two Lines, and the Attack began by a sharp Cannonade from our Field Pieces and Howitzers, the Lines advancing slowly, and frequently halting to give Time for the Artillery to fire. The Light Infantry was directed to force the Left Point of the Breast-work, to take the Rebel-Line in Flank, and the Grenadiers to attack in Front, supported by the 5th and 52d Battalion. These Orders were executed with Perseverance, under a heavy Fire from the vast Numbers of the Rebels; and notwithstanding various Impediments before the Troops could reach the Works, and though the Left under Brigadier-General Pigot was engaged also with the Rebels at Charles Town, which at a critical Mo-ment was set on Fire, the Brigadier pursued his Point, and carried the Redoubt.

The Rebels were then forced from other strong Holde, and purfued till they were drove clear off the Peninfula, leaving Five Pieces of Cannon be-

hind them.

The Loss the Rebels sustained must have been considerable from the great Numbers they carried off during the Time of Action, and buried in Holes, fince discovered, exclusive of what they suffered by the Shipping and Boats; near one hundred were buried the Day after, and thirty found wounded in the Field, three of which are fince dead.

I inclose your Lordship a Return of the killed and wounded of His Majesty's Troops.

This Action has shewn the Superiority of the King's Troops, who, under every Disadvantage, attacked and defeated above three Times their own Number, strongly posted and covered by Breastworks.

The Conduct of Major-General Howe was conspicuous on this Occasion, and his Example spirited the Troops, in which Major-General Clinton affisted, who followed the Reinforcement. And in Justice to Brigadier-General Pigot, I am to add, that the Success of the Day must in great Measure be attributed to his Firmness and Gallantry.

Lieutenant-Colonels Nesbit, Abercrombie, and Clarke; Majors Butler, Williams, Bruce, Spend-love, Smelt, Mitchell, Pitcairne, and Short, exerted themselves remarkably; and the Valour of the British Officers and Soldiers in general was at no Time more conspicuous than in this Action.

IN our late Examination of the Sheps of the Apothe-caries and others, who compound and fell Meaicines within the City and Suburbs of Lindon, we discovered that a false Tinctura Thebaica, prepared with a dis tilled Spirit instead of Wine, was sometimes sold; by means of which Alteration a Tincture of Opium (in the Dose of which the greatest Exactivate is necessary) may probably be made, containing a Proportion of that may provately to made, containing a respective of that powerful Drug, wery different from that which is contained in the genuine Tinaura Thebaica of the Pharmacopocia of the College of Physicians of London.

We likewise discovered that a Tinaure of Alces, prepared in like Manner with a diffilled Spirit instead

of Wine, was in some Shops substituted for Tinctura Sacra, and fold as fuch, though differing from it in a Cir-

cumftance of no Small Moment.

It was likewife found, that the Syrupus e Reconio was in some Shops not made according to the Pharmacopoeia of the College; but that some other Strap, with an Addition of Tincture Thebaice, was Substituted for it; and that in other Shops, though the proper Mate-

rials were used, the Composition was carelesty prepared. We therefore, the Censors of the College of Physicians, think it our Duty to take Public Notice of these Deviations from the established Orders of the College; and, by Virtue of the Authority committed to us by Law, we do berehy require all Persons within our Jurisdiction, whose Business it is to prepare and sell Medicines, as well with Respect to the other officinal Compositions as to those particularly mentioned above, strictly to follow the Directions published by the College, and not to sell any compound Medicine whatever, under the Title used in the London Pharmacopoeia, which has not been prepared with the Ingredients, and according to the exact Method there prescribed.
