The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HIS Majesty in Council was this Day pleased to order, That the Parliament, which stands prorogued to Thursday the Twenty-seventh of this Instant July, should be further prorogued to Thursday the Fourteenth Day of September next.

Moscow, June 27. Yesterday being the Great Dutches's Birth-day, the Empress, and the Great Duke, who came to Town the Day before for that Purpose, received the Compliments of the Nobility and Foreign Ministers on the Occasion, and in the Evening there was a Ball; but her Imperial Highness was so much indisposed as to prevent her appearing at all in the Course of the Day.

The Grand General Branicki, who arrived here a few Days before, was presented to the Empress; and Count Lavenhaupt had his Audiences of Leave: He proposes to set out tomorrow Morning. Count Schuwalow is pitched upon to return this Compliment to his Swedish Majesty.

The Empress, and their Imperial Highnesses, return this Evening to Kolominsky.

Hague, July 25. The Prince of Orange returned to Loo on Sunday Evening, the States of Holland having separated on Saturday last, but they will meet again early in August, when his Highness will return to this Place.

The King has been pleased to order Letters Patent to be made and passed under the Great Seal of the Kingdom of Ireland, containing His Majesty's Grant unto the Right Honourable Sir John Blaquiere, Knight of the Bath, of the Office or Offices of Aulnager and Collector of the Subsidies of Aulnage within the Kingdom of Ireland, and of all and every the Subsidies of Aulnage within the said Kingdom.

The King has been pleased to present the Reverend John Cloberry, Master of Arts, to the Vicarage of St. Helen in Abingdon, with the Chapels of Radley and Drayton thereunto annexed, in the County of Berks, and in the Diocese of Salisbury, now void by the Death of Andrew Portal, the last Incumbent.

Censors of the College of Physicians Examination.

IN our late Examination of the Shops of the Apothecaries and others, who compound and sell Medicines within the City and Suburbs of London, we discovered that a false Tinctura Thebaica, prepared with a distilled Spirit instead of Wine, was sometimes sold; by means of which Alteration a Tincture of Opium (in the Dose of which the greatest Exactitude is necessary)

may probably be made, containing a Proportion of that powerful Drug, very different from that which is contained in the genuine Tinctura Thebaica of the Pharmacopoeia of the College of Physicians of London.

We likewise discovered that a Tincture of Aloes, prepared in like Manner with a distilled Spirit instead of Wine, was in some Shops substituted for Tinctura Sacra, and sold as such, though differing from it in a Circumstance of no small Moment.

It was likewise found, that the Syrupus e Meconio was in some Shops not made according to the Pharmacopoeia of the College; but that some other Syrup, with an Addition of Tinctura Thebaica, was substituted for it; and that in other Shops, though the proper Materials were used, the Composition was carelessly prepared.

We therefore, the Censors of the College of Physicians, think it our Duty to take Public Notice of these Deviations from the established Orders of the College; and, by Virtue of the Authority committed to us by Law, we do hereby require all Persons within our Jurisdiction, whose Business it is to prepare and sell Medicines, as well with Respect to the other official Compositions as to those particularly mentioned above, strictly to follow the Directions published by the College, and not to sell any compound Medicine whatever, under the Title used in the London Pharmacopoeia, which has not been prepared with the Ingredients, and according to the exact Method there prescribed.
