PROCLAMATION, А For Suppressing Rebellion and Sedition.

GEORGE R.

HEREAS many of Our Subjects in divers Parts of Our Colonies and Plantations in North America, mifled by dangerous and ill-defigning Men, and forgetting the Allegiance which they owe to the Power that has protected and fuffained them, after various diforderly Acts committed in Disturbance of the Public Peace, to the Obstruction of lawful Com-merce, and to the Oppression of Our loyal Subjects carrying on the fame, have at length proceeded to an open and avowed Rebellion, by arraying themfelves in hoftile Manner to withftand the Execution of the Law, and traitoroufly preparing, ordering, and levying War against Us; And whereas there is Reafon to apprehend that fuch Rebellion hath been much promoted and encouraged by the traitorous Correspondence, Counfels, and Comfert of divers wicked and desperate Persons within this Realm : To the End therefore that none of Our Subjects may neglect or violate their Duty through Ignorance thereof, or through any Doubt of the Protection which the Law will afford to their Loyalty and Zeal; We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to iffue this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby declaring that not only all Our Of-ficers Civil and Military are obliged to exert their ptmost Endeavours to tuppress such Rebellion, and to bring the Traitors to Justice; but that all Our Subjects of this Realm and the Dominions thereunto belonging are bound by Law to be aiding and affilting in the Supprefion of fuch Rebellion, and to difclofe and make known all traitorous Confpiracies and Attempts against Us, Our Crown and Dignity; And We do accordingly strictly charge and command all Our Officers as well Civil as Military, and all other Our obedient and loyal Subjects, to use their utmost Endeavours to withstand and suppress such Rebellion, and to disclose and make known all Treafons and traitorous Confpiracies which they fhall know to be against Us, Our Crown and Dignity; and for that Purpole, that they transmit to One of Our Principal Secretaries of State, or other proper Officer, due and full Information of all Perfons who thall be found carrying on Correspondence with, or in any Manner or Degree aiding or abetting, the Perfons now in open Arms and Rebellion against Our Government within any of Our Colonies and Plantations in North America, in order to bring to condign Punishment the Authors, Perpetrators, and Abettors of fuch traitorous Defigns.

Given at Our Court at St. James's, the 23d Day of August, 1775, in the Fifteenth Year of Our Reign.

"The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council." W HEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the 5th of April last, to direct, that no Person or Persons whatfoever then held at Dublin, and fit for the Dispatch of

I should, at any Time during the Space of Six | Months, to commence from the 19th Day of the faid Month of April, prefume to transport out of this Kingdom, or carry Conttwife, any Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, (except the Matter-General, Lieutenant-General, or Principal Officers of the Ordnance, for His Majefty's Service) without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majefty, or His Privy Council; and whereas there is great Reafon to infpect, that great Fraud and Collution have been and may be practified in the Shipping and Exportation of Gun-powder, Arms, and Ammunition, under Licences which have been already granted; — His Majefly doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy-Council, hereby revoke and make void all and every Licence and Permiflion which have been hitherto granted for the Exportation or carrying Coaffwife of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition; and doth hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that, during the Space of Three Months from the Date of this His Majefly's Order in Council, no Perfon or Perfons whatloever (except the Maller-General, Lieutenant-General, or Principal Officers of the Ordnance, for His Majefty's Service) do prelume, without Leave or Per-million in that Behalf first obtained from His Ma-jefty, or His Privy Council, to transport, into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coaltwife, any Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms of Ammunition, or fhip or lade any Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on Board any Ship or Vetlel, in or-der to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coaltwife, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act pathed in the 29th Year of His late Majetty's Reign, intifuled, "An Act " to impower His Majefly to prohibit the Exportation " of Salt-petre, and to inforce the Law for im-" powering His Majefly to prohibit the Exportation "of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms and Am-"munition; and alfo to impower His Majefty to "reftrain the carrying Coaffwife of Salt petre, "Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammu-"nition." And the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Mafter-General of the Ordnance, and His Majefty's S cretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.
