St. James's, September 22.
THIS Day, being the Anniversary of Their Majesties Coronation, there was a numerous and splendid Appearance at Court of the Nobility, Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Distinction, to compliment Their Majesties on the Occasion. The Park and Tower Guns were fired at Noon, and in the Evening there were Illuminations, and all Publick Demonstrations of Joy.

St. James's, September 20.
 The King has been pleased to appoint Robert Ainslie, Esq; to be His Majesty's Ambassador to the Ottoman Porte, in the Room of John Murray, Esq; deceased; and His Majesty was pleased this Day to confer upon him the Honour of Knighthood; upon which Occasions he had the Honour to kiss His Majesty's Hand.

Moscow, August 21. N. S. As the Empress's Return to Town on Thursday last would have interrupted a Course of Mineral Waters, which her Imperial Majesty has been advised by her Physicians to continue some Time longer, the Anniversary of the Festival of the Preobrazinskiy Regiment of Guards was celebrated at her Majesty's Country Residence, where the Officers had the Honour of Dining with her Imperial Majesty.

An Ukase is published here, ordering Horses to be ready upon the Road for the Journey of the Court to Petersburg, between the 4th of December and the 4th of January next.

Stockholm, September 5. Their Swedish Majesties removed last Week to Grypholm, where the Duke of Sudermania joined them soon after his Return from Scania.

Vienna, September 9. A Placart has been lately issued in Bohemia, regulating the Quantity of Statute Labour to be performed by each Peasant, and considerably lessening it. It is to be hoped this Publication will put a Stop to the unlawful Assemblies of the lower Class of People in that Country, though we still receive Informations of their riotous Spirit not having totally subsided.

Berlin, September 12. His Prussian Majesty arrived last Night at Charlottenbourg, and this Day and Tomorrow his Majesty will review the Corps of Artillery; and the Garrison of this Place, consisting of Cavalry and Infantry, will perform the new Evolutions, in which they have been lately instructed by his Majesty's Command.

Dresden, September 13. Last Saturday Night her Serene Highness the Reigning Electress of Saxony returned to Dresden in perfect Health from the Baths of Lauehstaedt. The following Day was observed as a Grand Gala at Court: In the Morning her Electoral Highness received the Compli-

ments of Congratulation, on her Recovery, of the Foreign Ministers and Nobility; and after the Evening Drawing-Room the whole Electoral Family returned as usual to Pilsnitz.

Hague, September 19. The Prince and Princess of Orange have left Loo; and, after staying some Days at Soesdyck near Utrecht, will return to this Place for the Winter.

The Prince of Orange has given to his youngest Son, his Serene Highness Prince William-George-Frederick, the Regiment of Foot vacant by the Death of Major General Burmania; and has appointed his Serene Highness the Landgrave William of Hesse-Philippthal, Lieutenant-General of Horse, to be Governor of Sas de Gand.

His Serene Highness the Field-Marshal Duke of Brunswick-Lunenbourg arrived here two Days ago from his Government of Bois-le-Duc.
