May it pleafe your Majefty,

E, your Majeity's moft dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Mayor, Recorder, Aldermen, Burgefles, and Inhabitants, of the Borough of Warwick, unbiaffed by Party, unawed by Faction, and not blinded by falfe Patriotifm, but actuated by a dutiful and fincere Regard for your Majefty's Perfon, arifing from the cleareft Conviction of your Majefty's earneft Withes and Endeavours to promote the Profperity of Great Britain, humbly prefume to addrefs your Majefty, with Hearts replete with Gratitude for the innumerable Bleffings, which, through Providence, and the Wifdom and Mildnefs of your Majefty's Government, we now enjoy.

It is with the utmost Concern we fee the Acts of the British Legislature contemned and opposed by many of your Majesty's Subjects in North America, through the Incitement and Missepresentation of artful, designing, and feditious Men, both at Home and Abroad; who, under the species Pretext of preferving the Liberty of the People, are aiming at a total Subversion of all Law and good Government, and confequently introducing the worst of Tyrannies.

And, at this alarming Crifis, we confider ourfelves obliged, as loyal Subjects, and real Friends to the true Intereft of Great Britain and it's ineftimable Confliction, to affure your Majefty', that, as the lenient Treatment of your Majefty's infatuated and mifled Subjects in America has been infufficient to induce and prevail on them to return to their Reafon and Allegiance, we apprehend compulsory and effectual Methods are not only juftifiable in Law and Conficience, but abfolutely expedient to be exerted with Vigour and Refolution.

And we beg Leave to affure your Majefly, that we will, with Alacrity and Spirit, fupport, to the utmost of our Ability, fuch Measures as your Majefty shall think proper to purfue, for enforcing and maintaining Obedience to the Laws in every Part of your Majefly's Dominions; entirely confiding in your Majefly's Goodness, because we are fully fatissied, that, upon this important Occasion, every Plan which your Majefly shall adopt will be fo judiciously concerted and wisely directed, that it willpreferve the Freedom of the Conflictution inviolate, and advance the Honour and Prosperity of this -Kingdom.
