A PROCLAMATION,

Appointing the Distribution of Prizes taken during the Continuance of the Rebellion now subsifing in divers Parts of the Continent of North America.

GEORGE R.

HEREAS by an Act, made in this pre-fent Sellion of Parliament, intituled, "An " Act to prohibit all Trade and Inter-" courfe with the Colonies of New Hamp-" fhire, Maffachulet's Bay, Rhode Ifland, Connecticut, " New York, New Jerfey, Penfylvania, the Three " Lower Counties on Delaware, Maryland, Virginia, " North Carolina, South Carolina, and Georgia, during the Continuance of the prefent Rebellion within the faid Colonies refpectively; for repealing an Act, made in the Fourteenth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, to difcontinue the Landing and Dif-charging, Lading or Shipping, of Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, at the Town and within the Har-bour of Bofton in the Province of Maffachufer's 86 " bour of Boston, in the Province of Massachulet's Bay; and also Two Acts, made in the last Sellon of Parliament, for restraining the Trade and Commerce of the Colonies in the said Acts respectively men-"tioned; and to enable any Perfon or Perfons, ap-"pointed and authorized by His Majefty, to grant Par-"dens, to iffue Proclamations, in the Cafes and for "the Purpofes therein mentioned;" it is, amongh other Things, enacted, That all Ships and Veffels of or λ¢. belonging to the Inhabitants of the faid Colonies, together with their Cargoes, Apparel, and Furniture, except as in the faid Act are excepted, and all other Ships and Vefiels whatfoever, together with their Cargoes, Appa-rel, and Furniture, which fhall be found trading in any Port or Place of the faid Colonics, or going to trade, or coming from Trading, in any fuch Port or Place, except as are therein allo excepted, fhall become forfeited to His Majefty, as if the fame were the Ships and Ef-fc is of Open Enemies, and fhall be fo adjudged, deemed, and taken, in all Courts of Admiralty, and in all other Courts whatfoever: And, for the Encourage-ment of the Officers and Seamen of His Majefty's Ships of War, it is thereby alfo further eracted. That the ther with their Cargoes, Apparel, and Furniture, except of War, it is thereby alfo further enacted, That the Flag Officers, Captains, Commanders, and other com-millioned Officers in His Majefty's Pay, and alfo the Scamen, Marines, and Soldiers on Board, fhall have the fole Intereft and Property of and in all and every such Ship, Veffel, Goods, and Merchandize, which they fhall feize and take, (being first adjudged lawful Prize in any of His Majefty's Courts of Admiralty) to be divided in fuch Proportions, and after fuch Manner, as His Majefty shall think fit to order and direct by Proas His Majefty shall think fit to order and direct by Pro-elamation or Proclamations hereafter to be islued for shofe Purpoles: We, taking the Premises into Confider-ation, do, purfuant to the faid Act of Parliament, (with the Advice of Our Privy Council) by this Cur Procla-mation, order, direct, and appoint, That the neat Pro-duce of all Prizes taken, in Purfuance of the faid Act, by Our Ships of War, be divided into Eight equal Parts, and be distributed in Manner following, that is to fay, To the Captain or Captains of any of Our Ships of War, who shall be actually on Board at the Taking of any Prize, Three Eighth Parts; but in cafe any fuch Prize shall be taken by any of Our Ship of War, under the Command of a Flag or Flags, the Flag Officer or Officers being actually on Board, or directing Officer or Officers being actually on Board, or directing and affifting in the Capture, shall have One of the faid Three Eighth Parts, the faid One Eighth Part to be paid to fuch Flag or Flag Officers, in fuch Proportions; and fubject to fuch Regulations, as are herein-after for that Purpole mentioned: To the Captains of Marines and Land Forces, Sea Lieutenants and Mafter, on Board any fuch Ships, One Eighth Part, to be equally divided amongst them : To the Lieutenants and Quarter-Mafters of Marines, and Lieutenants, Enfigns, and Quarter-Mailers, of Land Forces, Boatfwain, Gunner, Purfer, Carpenter, Mafter's Mate, Chirurgeon, Pilot, and

Chaplain, on Board any fuch Ship, One Eighth Part, to be equally divided amongst them: To the Midship-men, Secretary to Flag Officers, Captain's Clerk, Ma-fter Sail Maker, Carpenter's Mates, Boatswain's Mates, Gunner's Mates, Mafter at Arms, Corporals, Yeomen of the Sheets, Coxfwaih, Quarter Mafters, Quarter Matter's Mates, Convening, Quarter matters, Quarter Matter's Mates, Chirurgeon's Mates, Yeomen of the Powder Room, and Serjeants of Marines or Land Forces, on Board any fuch Ships, One Eighth Part, to be equally divided amongft them : To the Trumpeters, Quarter-Gunners, Carpenter's Crew, Steward, Cook, Armourer, Steward's Mate, Cook's Mate, Gunfmith, Cooper, Swabber, Ordinary Trumpeter, Barber, Able Seamen, Ordinary Seamen, and Marine or other Sol-diers, and all other Perfons doing Duty or affifting on Board any fuch Ships, Two Eighth Parts, to be equally divided amongf them. And in cafe any See Cortain divided amongst them. And in cale any Sea Captain, inferior Commission or Warrant Sea Officers, belonging to any Ship of War, for whom any Shares of Prizes are hereby allowed, be absent at the Time of the Capture of any Prize, the Share of fuch Sea Captain, inferior Commission or Warrant Sea Officer, shall be cast into the Shares hereby allowed to the Trumpeters, Quarter Gunners, Carpenter's Crew, Steward, Cook, Armourer, Steward's Mate, Cook's Mate, Gunfmith, Cooper, Swabber, Ordinary Trumpeter, Barber, Able Seamen, Ordinary Seamen, and Marine or other Soldiers, and other Perfort doing Duty or affifting on Board any fuch Ships, to be equally divided amount them. Provided, That if any Officer or Officers on Board any of Our Ships of War, at the Time of taking any fuch Prizes, fhall have more Commiffions or Offices than one, he or they fhall be initited only to the Share or Shares of the faid Prizes, which, according to the above-mentioned Diffribution, fhall belong to his or their respective fuperior Commisfions or Offices. And We do hereby friftly enjoin all and every Commander and Commanders of any Ships of War, taking any Prize, as foon as may be, to tranf-mit, or caufe to be tranfmitted, to the Commiffioners of Our Navy, a true Lift of the Names of all the Officers, Seamen, Marines, Soldiers, or others, who were actu-ally on Board Our Ships of War, under his or their Command, at the taking fuch Prize ; which Lift fhall contain the Quality of the Service of each Perfon on Board, and be subscribed by the Captain or Command-ing Officer, and Three or more of the Chief Officers on Board. And We do hereby require and direct the Com-millioners of Our Navy, or any Three or more of them, to examine; or caule to be examined, fuch Lifts by the Mufter-Books of fuch Ships of War, and Lifts an-nexed thereto, to fee that fuch Lifts do agree with the Qualities, or Ratings of the Officers, Seamon, Marinee, Soldiers, and others belonging to fuch Ship of War; and, upon Requeft, forthwith to grant a Certificate of the Truth of any Lift transmitted to them, to the Agents nominated and appointed by the Captors, purfuant to the faid Act, to take Care or dispose of such Prize ; and alfo, upon Application to them, to give, or caufe to be given, unto the Agents who fhall, at any Time or Times, be appointed as aforefaid by the Captors, all fuch Lifts from the Müfter-Books of any fuch Ships of War, and annexed Lifts, as the faid Agents fhall find requilite for their Direction in paying the Produce of fuch Prizes, and to be otherwife aiding and affitting to the faid Agents, as fhall be necesfary. And as touching the faid Agents, as faal be neceffary. And as touch-ing the faid One Eighth Part, herein before mentioned ing the faid One Eighth Part, herein before mentroned to be granted to the Flag or Flag Officero, who fhall be actually on Board at the taking of any Prize, or fhall be directing and affifting therein, We have thought fit, and do, by thefe Preients, publich, order, and declare, that the following Regulations be ob-ferved; First, That a Flag Officer commanding in Chief, where there is but One Flag Officer upon Service, foall have to his own life the fuid One Fighth Part of thail have to his own Ufe the faid One Eighth Part of the Prizes taken by Ships under his Command: Sz-condly, That a Flag Officer fent to command at Jamaica, or eliewhere, fhall have no Right to any Share of the Prives

Prizes taken by Ships employed there, before he arrives at the Place to which he is fent, and actually takes upon him the Command: Thirdly, That when an inferiot Flag Officer is fent out to reinforce a faperior Flag Offi-cer at Jamaica, or elfewhere, the faid fuperior Flag.Offi-fhall have no Right to any Share in the Prizes taken by them before they arrive within the Limite of his Comthem before they arrive within the Limits of his Command, and actually receive forme Orders from him : Fourthly, That a Chief Flag Officer returning Home from Jamaica, or elfewhere, thall have no Share of the Prizes taken by the Ships left behind to act under another Command: Fifthly, That if a Flag Officer is fent to command in the Out-ports of this Kingdom, he shall have no Share of the Prizes taken by Ships that failed from that Port, by Order from the Admiralty : Sixthly, That when more Flag Officers than One lerve together, the Eighth Part of the Prizes taken by any Ships of the Fleet, or Squadron, shall be divided in the following Proportions; videlicet, If there be but Two Flag Officers, the Chief shall have Two Third Parts of the faid One Eighth Part, and the other shall have the remaining Third Part ; but if the Number of Flag Officers be more than Two, the Chief shall have only One Half, and the other Half shall be divided equally among the other Flag Officers: Seventhly, That Commodores, with Captains under them, shall be esteemed as Flag Officers, with respect to their Right to an Eighth Part of Prizes taken, whicher commanding in Chief, or serving under Command.

Whiteball, December 23. THIS Morning Brook Watfon, Efg; arrived at Lord George Germain's Office from Quebec, with Difpatches from Major-General Carleton, dated Montreal, the 5th of November, containing Intelli-gence, that General Carleton, not being able to collect a Force that might be depended upon for the Relief of St. John's, the Rebels had taken Advantage of the Defection of the lower Clais of Canadians to prefs forward their Enterprize; and that the Forts of Cham-blée and St. John upon Richlien River, the latter of which had ftopped the Progrefs of the Rebels for above which had stopped the Progress of the Rebels for above Two Months, had surrendered, and the Garrisons were made Prisoners upon Capitulation.

By a Letter from Lieutenant-Governor Cramahé, dated Quebec, November 9, it appears, that a Party of Rebels, under the Command of one Arnold, had invaded the Province by the Way of the River Chaudiere; and that Part of them were actually arrived, and had taken Poft at Point Levi opposite to Quebec.
