PROCLAMATION, Â For Encouraging Seamen to enter themselves on Board His Majesty's Ships of War.

GEORGE. R

HEREAS it is Our Royal Intention to give all due Encouragement to all fuch Seamen who shall voluntarily enter themfelves in Our Service; We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to

publish this Our Roval Proclamation : And We do publish this Our Royal Proclamation: And we do hereby promife and declare, That all fuch Able Sea-men, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, fit for Our Service, who shall, on or before the Twenty-ninth Day of February next, voluntarily enter themselves to ferve in Our Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of Our Ships, or the Chief Officers on Board fuch Tenders as fhall be employed for railing Men for the Service of Our Navy, fhall receive, as Our Royal Bounty, the Sum of Forty Shillings each Man; and all fuch Ordi-nary Seamen, fit for Our Service, who fhall fo enter themfelves as aforefaid, shall receive the Sum of Twenty shillings each Man, as Our Royal Bounty; fuch re-spective Sums to be paid them by the respective Clerks of the Cheque, refiding at the Ports or Places where the Shios into which they shall be entered shall be, immediately after the Third Muster of such Seamen : And We do after the Third Multer of fuch Seamen : And We do declare, That the Qualifications of the Seamen fo en-tering themfelves, as aforefaid, fhall be certified by the Captain, Matter, and Boatfwain of the Ship or Veffel where they fhall enter. And, for Prevention of any Abučes, by any Perfons leaving the Veffels to which they fhall belong, and entering themfelves on Board any other Ships or Veffels, in order to obtain the faid Bounty Money; We do hereby declare and command, That fuch Seamen, belonging to any of Our Ships or Veffels, as thall abfort themfelves from any of the faid Ships or Veffels to which they then any of the faid Ships or Veffels to which easy fhall belong, and fhall enter them-felves on Board any other of Our faid Ships or Veffels, in order to obtain the faid Bounty, shall not only lose the Wages due to them in the Ships or Veffels they shall leave, but also be feverely punished according to their Denierits.

Given at our Court at St. James's, the Third Day of January, One thousand feven hundred and fe-venty-fix, in the Sixteenth Year of Our Reign.

St. James's, January 6, 1776. T is His Majefty's Pleasure, That all Officers, belonging to His Majefty's 3d, 9th, 11th, 20th, 24th, 34th, 53d, and 62d Regiments of Foot, now ferving in Ireland, do immediately repair to their · Corps in that Kingdom, except fuch as belong to Additional Companies of those Regiments, or -fuch as may be ordered on the Recruiting Service, or other Duty.
