St. James's, January 9. HE following Address of the Gentlemen, Clergy, Freemen, Freeholders, Merchants, Traders, Manufacturers, and other Citizens of Dublin, having been transmitted to the Right Honourable Lord Viscount Weymouth, One of His Majefty's Principal Secretaries of State, has been prefented to His Majefty : Which Addrefs His Majefty was pleafed to receive very gracioufly.

To the KING's most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of the Gontlemen, Clergy, Freemen, Freeholders, Merchants, Traders, Manufacturers, and other Citizens of Dublin.

May it pleafe your Majefly, WE, the Gentlemen, Clergy, Freemen, Freehold-ers, Mcrchants, Traders, Manufacturers, and other Citizens of Dublin, the Metropolis of your Majefty's Kingdom of Ireland, feeling ourfelves at this Time particularly called upon, embrace with Pleafure the Opportunity of tellifying to your Majelly our fleadfaft Loy-alty, and zealous Attachment to your Sacred Perfon, Crown, and Dignity; for the Prefervation and Honour of which, we are and ever shall be ready to devote our Lives and Fortunes; truly femible of the Happinel's we enjoy under your Majesty's mild and auspicious Government.

We hear, with equal Sorrow and Aftonifunent, that many of your mifguided Subjects in America have withdrawn themfelves from their Allegiance to your Majefty. We lament that, influenced by the Counfels of wicked and defigning Men, they have even dared to adopt a System tending to render themselves independent of the Farent Country; yet, deeply affected by the Troubles; fubfifting in the Colonies we have the fulleft Reliance on your Majefty's Wifdom and Juffice, that you will purfue with Firmnels fuch Measures as may tend effectually to reftore the violated Rights of the British Empire.

We feel ourselves bound, at so important and critical a Conjuncture, most humbly and zealoufly to lay our Hearts at the Foot of the Throne, and to express our warmeft Gratitude for your Majefty's paternal Good-nefs to this your Kingdom of Ireland, fo recently and fo amply flewn by feveral Acts of the British Parlia-ment for the Encouragement of our Commerce, Manufactures, and Agriculture : And our Duty alfo leads us to acknowledge the grateful Senfe we entertain of your Majefty's peculiar Indulgence, in fending to prefice over us fo excellent a Chief Governor; to whole faithful Re-prefentation of our Loyalty and Attachment we attribute thele important Advantages, which have flowed to us from your Royal Protection and Favour.

Alarmed with Apprehenfions from what we have heard, and grateful for the Bleffings we feel and enjoy, we cannot avoid fervently to offer our Prayers to the Almighty, for the Prefervation of your Majeffy's Royal Perfon and Family; that your Reign over us may be long and happy, and that you may ever triumph over the Enemies of our glorious Conflicution.

# PROCLAMATION,

For Encouraging Seamen to enter themselves on Board. His Majesty's Ships of War.

A

HEREAS it is Our Royal Intention to give all due Encouragement to all fuch Seamen who shall voluntarily enter themfelves in Our Service; We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to

fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation: And We do hereby promife and declare, That all fuch Able Sea-meň, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, fit for Our Service, who shall, on or before the Tw.nty-ninth Day of February next, voluntarily enter themfelves to ferve in Our Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of Our Ships, or the Chief Officers on Board fuch Tenders as shall be employed for raising Men for the Service of Our Navy, shall receive, as Our Royal Bounty, the Sum of Ferty Stillings each Man; and all fuch Ordi-Sum of Forty Shillings each Man; and all fuch Ordinary Seamen, fit for Our Service, who fhall fo enter themfelves as aforelaid, shall receive the Sum of Twenty Shillings each Man, as Our Royal Bounty; fuch re-spective Sums to be paid them by the respective Clerks of the Cheque, refiding at the Ports or Places where the Ships into which they shall be entered shall be, immediately after the Third Muster of such Seamen : And We do declare, That the Qualifications of the Seamen so endeclare, That the Qualifications of the Seamen do en-tering themfelves, as aforefaid, fhall be certified by the Captain, Malter, and Boatfwain of the Ship or Veffel where they fhall enter. And, for Prevention of any Abufes, by any Perfons leaving the Veffels to which they fhall belong, and entering themfelves on Board any other Ships or Veffels, in order to obtain the faid Bounty Money; We do hereby declare and command, That fuch Seamen, belonging to any of Our Ships or Veffeis, as shall absent themselves from any of the faid Ships or Veffels to which they shall belong, and shall enter them-felves on Boatd any other of Our faid Ships or Vessels, in order to obtain the faid Bounty, shall not only lofe

the Wages due to them in the Ships or Vessels they shalt leave, but also be feverely punished according to their Demerits.
