# PROCLAMATION,

For Encouraging Seamen to enter themselves on Board. His Majesty's Ships of War.

GEORGE R.

A

HEREAS it is Our Royal Intention to give all due Encouragement to all fuch Seamen who shall voluntarily enter themfelves in Our Service; We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to

fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation: And We do hereby promife and declare, That all fuch Able Sea-meň, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, fit for Our Service, who shall, on or before the Tw.nty-ninth Day of February next, voluntarily enter themfelves to ferve in Our Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of Our Ships, or the Chief Officers on Board fuch Tenders as shall be employed for raising Men for the Service of Our Navy, shall receive, as Our Royal Bounty, the Sum of Ferty Stillings each Man; and all fuch Ordi-Sum of Forty Shillings each Man; and all fuch Ordinary Seamen, fit for Our Service, who fhall fo enter themfelves as aforelaid, shall receive the Sum of Twenty Shillings each Man, as Our Royal Bounty; fuch re-spective Sums to be paid them by the respective Clerks of the Cheque, refiding at the Ports or Places where the Ships into which they shall be entered shall be, immediately after the Third Muster of such Seamen : And We do declare, That the Qualifications of the Seamen so endeclare, That the Qualifications of the Seamen do en-tering themfelves, as aforefaid, fhall be certified by the Captain, Malter, and Boatfwain of the Ship or Veffel where they fhall enter. And, for Prevention of any Abufes, by any Perfons leaving the Veffels to which they fhall belong, and entering themfelves on Board any other Ships or Veffels, in order to obtain the faid Bounty Money; We do hereby declare and command, That fuch Seamen, belonging to any of Our Ships or Veffeis, as shall absent themselves from any of the faid Ships or Veffels to which they shall belong, and shall enter them-felves on Boatd any other of Our faid Ships or Vessels, in order to obtain the faid Bounty, shall not only lofe

the Wages due to them in the Ships or Vessels they shalt leave, but also be feverely punished according to their Demerits.

Given at our Court at St. Jamei's, the Third Day of January, One thousand leven hundred and fe-venty-fix, in the Sixteenth Year of Our Reign. GOD fave the KING.
