We are told that his Highnefs means to part hence about Wednefday next, on his way to Wefeh, wheté he will meet and have a Conference with the Elector of Brandenbuig, and it iseven faid, that fome of the Dukes of Lunenburg will likewife come thither. It is belifeved that the matter, of the Reprifals obtained by the Prince of Orange againt Spain, for Moneys which have been long owing gion from that Crewn, will reminin there, and that the faid Reprifals will not be taken ous. From Anzferdaym we bear, that thofe Magiftrates had had feveral qunfubiationg haw to procced againft Rathes, who as you have heard was lately apprehended there, for having been the Author of feveral wickedand fcandalous Libels againft this Government; there be thofe we hear that cbink be ought only to be lookt upqn as a Food or mad Man, and that he thould accordingly be put inte the place appointed for fuch peom ple. The Refidens of the Hanfe Towns, has, as we are informed, given in a Memorial to the Srates, to thank them fot the Offices they have emplayed to oppofe the fetinig up the new Tolls, which is preerended at ©luckfadt upan the Elbes and to pray they will fill continue them. The Pencionary Fageh hath been wery much indifpofed, but at prefens is fomewhat bettar. It hath been prothiluited on very fevere penalties to trapel in Wagors, or $\$$ leds over the Ice from Gorcum upwards, that fo a way mighe nor be marked oue to the Enemy.

Ditio, Jun. 19. Our Leters from Hamburg give us an accoust of the indifpofition of the Elector of Brandenburg, which will retard the interview intended between bim and tha Prince of Orange at Wefel or Cleves, The States General have recomanended if to the Magiffrates of Amferdam to do feecy and exemplary juftice upon Rothes and his Accomplices, as difturbers of ste publich Peace. On Tuefday yext the States of Holtand will be affembled, to take into confderation the demand of the Councel of State, concernIng the Moneys neceflary for defraying the oxpences of the next Campagne. From Denmark our advices rell us, that the Suedes continue ablolure Mafters of the Field in Schonen; that they had arracked the Cafle at ficlifingurg, and though they had beea repulfed, yet it is fearey it willat laft fall moo the Enemies hands. Since the conclufion of the Pcice between the Poles and the iTurks, the Mofcovites feeto abfolutely refolvedro continue the fricndhip and good correfpondence with the Grown of Sueden, and to have rathes an inclination of eqrring into 2 War againft the Poles.
Pafis, Jan, 13. We have had feveral reporit heve concerning the eaking of Melazzo and Catanea in Sicily by the Duke de Vivonne, but they need aconfirma. tion before we give credir to them. Our Troops contipue to march towards $\$$ landers, for which this reafon is given, that fince the King who as he does not require any Contriburions from the Spanifh Subjects, fo likewife will not permit his Subjetis to pay any, thinks it neceffrery to have the faid Troops march towards thofe parts, to fecure them againf the Enemy, and ro preyent their executions, which they will otherwife make,to oblige the Inbabitants to pay the Contributions they demand. The King bas given the Cardital d'Eftrees leave to recurn hither from Rome, to look after fome Concerns of his own, though the time allowed him to do it in, is only three months. The Regiment of the
