HE following Address of the Deacon Conveener, Deacons of the Fourteen Incorporated Trades, and other Members of the Trades House, of the City of Glasgow, has been presented to His Majesty by the Right Honourable Lord Frederick Campbell, their Representative in Parliament, being introduced by the Lord of His Majesty's Bed-chamber in Waiting: Which Address His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

Most Gracious Sovereign, X/E, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Deacon Conveener, Deacons of the Fourteen Incorporated Trades, and other Members of the Trades House, of the City of Glasgow, at a General Meeting assembled, impressed with the most unalterable Sentiments of Loyalty and Affection to your Majefty's Person and Government, humbly beg Leave, at this Time, with unseigned Hearts, to express our Abhorrence and Detestation of that unprovoked and unnatural Rebellion now prevailing in tome of your Majefty's Colonies in America. To levy War against their Sovereign, acknowledged to be the best of Kings; against the Government, who has always protected them when in Danger, and defended them from the Attacks of Foreign Enemies; against the Nation from which they sprung, and against their Friends and Fellowthey sprung, and against their Friends and renow-Subjects; all for the most frivolous Causes that ever ex-cited Sedition; indicates too strongly their Intention to Britain, which, we firmly believe, they are bound to obey. We, however, have the Pleasure of informing your Majesty, that, notwithstanding of this unnatural Rebellion, our Trade and Manufactures in general are in a prosperous State; and, as we have hitherto enjoyed all the Blessings and Advantages which have flowed all the Bleffings and Advantages which have nowed from your Majesty's just, wise; and prudent Adminification; so, in Duty, we from the Sincerity of our Hearts declare, that with our Lives and Fortunes we will support and defend your Majesty's Person and Government, to the utmost of our Power, in quelling the unnatural Rebellion now substituting in America; and in restoring the Rebellious Colonies to a due Submission to the Laws and Government of Great Britain.
