**O**N Saturday last there was a grand Supper and Ball at his Royal Highness Prince Ferdinand of Prussia's, in Honour of the Birth-Day of his Royal Highness Prince Henry; and Tomorrow, being his Prussian Majesty's Birth-Day, there will be a grand Gala at Court.

*Petersburgh, January 9.* The Empress left Moscow on Sunday the 20th of last Month, and arrived at Zarco-Zelo on Christmas Eve; from which Place her Imperial Majesty, accompanied by the Great Duke and Dutchess, came to this City on Saturday last.

The Day before her Imperial Majesty's Departure from Moscow, the Turkish Ambassador had his Audience of Leave.

*St. James's, February 10.*

The King has been pleased to order a Commission to be passed under the Great Seal of Great Britain, for constituting and appointing Henry Earl Bathurst, Chancellor of Great Britain, to be High Steward of Great Britain, for the Trial of Elizabeth, calling herself Dutchess Dowager of Kingston, upon an Indictment of Bigamy, found against her by the Grand Jury of the County of Middlesex.

The King has been pleased to appoint David Ross, Esq; to be one of the Ordinary Lords of His Majesty's Session in that Part of the Kingdom of Great Britain called Scotland, in the Room of Andrew Pringle, Lord Alemoor, deceased.

Yesterday, being the Day appointed for celebrating Her Majesty's Birth-Day, the Flag was displayed on Bedford Tower; the Great Guns in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired three Rounds, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn out in the Royal Square at the Barracks. At Noon there was a very numerous Assembly of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction, of both Sexes, at the Castle, who appeared in extraordinary Splendour to compliment his Excellency, before whom an Ode set to Musick was performed. In the Evening a Play was given by his Excellency to the Ladies; and at Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy, throughout the City; and at the Castle the Ball and the several Entertainments were extremely grand, and conducted with the greatest Regularity; and the Decorations of the Ball and Supper-Room particularly elegant.
