May it please your Majesty,

WE, the Justices of Peace, Freeholders, Commissioners of Supply and Land-Owners of the County of Wigton, humbly beg Leave to assure your Majesty of our stedfast Loyalty and zealous Attachment to your Sacred Person, Crown and Dignity, and the happy Constitution under which we live, the Preservation of which we are, and ever shall be, ready to support, with our Lives and Fortunes, being fully sensible of the many Blessings we enjoy under your Majesty's most benign Government.
