The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council. W Hereas the Time limited by His Majefty's Or-der in Council of the day of t der in Council of the 22d of November last, for prohibiting the Exporting out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coaftwife, Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire on the 23d of this Inftant February : And whereas it is judged expedient, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for fome Time longer, except in those Cafes where (for the Benefit and Advantage of Trade, and for the Use and Defence of Ships trading to Foreign Parts, and of the Transports and Victualling Vef-fels employed in His Majesty's Service) His Majesty, by His feveral Orders in Council of the 13th and 27th of October, and of the 6th and 22d of November, 1775, and of the 5th and 19th of this Inftant February, has thought proper to permit and allow the Exportation of and carrying Coaftwife Gunpowder, Saltpetre, Arms and Ammunition, under certain Conditions and Reftrictions mentioned in the faid Orders: His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whomfoever (except the Ma-fter-General, Lieutenant-General, or Principal Officers of the Ordnance for His Majefty's Service) do at any Time, during the Space of Three Months, to commence from the faid 23d Day of this Infant February, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coaftwife, any Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or fhip or lade any Gunpowder, Salt. petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Veflel, in order to transporting the fame beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coaftwife, except in the Cafes comprised within the aforem ntioned Orders in Council of the 13th and 27th of October, and the 6th and 22d of November, 1775, and of the 5th and 19th of this Instant February, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act paffed in the 20th Year of His late Majeily's Reign, entituled, "An "Act to impower His Majefty to prohibit the Ex-" portation of Saltpetre, and to enforce the Law for " empowering His Majefty to prohibit the Ex-" portation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms " and Ammunition; and alfo to impower His Ma-" jefty to reftrain the carrying Coaftwife of Salt. " petty to rentrain the carrying coattwhe of Sait. "pette, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Am-"munition:" — And the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Commiffioners for Ex. ecuting the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Mafter General of the Ordnance, and His Majefty's Secretary at War, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as to them may refpectively apper-G. A^T the Court at St. James's, the 21ft Day of Land Service, who might be induced to return to their Duty by an Offer of His Majefty's gracious Patdon; and that fuch an Instance of His Royal Clemency would have due Influence upon their future Behaviour : His Majesty is pleased to grant His Free Pardon to all Deserters from His Land Forces who shall furrender themselves, before the toth Day of April next, either to the Regiments to which they belong, or to fome other Corps in His Majefty's Service, or to any Additional Company or Recruiting Party in Great Britain or Ireland.

Such Deferters, if ablebodied Men and fit for Service, shall be attested in the Corps to which they furrender, and not be liable to be claimed by any other Corps to which they may formerly have belonged.

And whereas many of the faid Deferters may have inlifted in other Corps, and are now ferving therein; His Majesty is graciously pleased to extend to fuch Deferters the Benefit of this Pardon, and to direct, That they shall continue to ferve in the Corps wherein they now are, and not be claimed by that in which they formerly ferved.

And wheteas feveral of the faid Deferters have been apprehended, and are now in Gaol or in Re-gimental Cuftody: His Majefty is likewife pleafed to grant to them His Free Pardon, of which they are to have the Benefit, upon their Arrival at their refpective Regiments, or upon their being inlifted by fome other Corps, or Recruiting Party.

Any Soldier who may defert, after thefe His Majesty's most gracious Intentions are made Public, shall not be included in the above Pardon, but be proceeded against with the utmost Severity.
