of November laft, for prohibiting the Exporting out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwise, Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammanition, will expire on the 23d of this Inftant February : And whereas it is judged expe-dient, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for fome Time longer, except in those Cases where (for the Benefit and Advantage of Trade, and for the Use and Defence of Ships trading to Foreign Parts, and of the Transports and Victualling Vef-fels employed in His Majesty's Service) His Majesty, by His feveral Orders in Council of the 13th and 27th of October, and of the 6th and 22d of No-27th or October, and or the oth and 22d or No-vember, 1775, and of the 5th and 19th of this Inftant February, has thought proper to permit and allow the Exportation of and carrying Coaffwife Gunpowder, Saltpetre; Arms and Ammunition, under certain Conditions and Reflrictions mentioned in the faid Orders: His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, by and with the Advice of this rivy council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whomfoever (except the Ma-fler-General; Lieutenant-General, or Principal Of-fleers of the Ordnance for His Majefly's Service) do at any Time, during the Space of Three Months, to commence from the faid 23d Day of this Infeast Fabricary profilme to transport into any this Instant February, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coaltwife, any Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the fame beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coaltwife, ex-cept in the Cafes comprifed within the aforementioned Orders in Council of the 13th and 27th of October, and the 6th and 22d of November, 1775, and of the 5th and 19th of this Inftant February, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majefty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the refpective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the 29th Year of His late Majeily's Reign, entiruled, " An " Act to impower His Majefty to prohibit the Ex-" portation of Saltpetre, and to enforce the Law for "empowering His Majefty to prohibit the Ex-portation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms. and Ammunition; and alfo to impower His Ma-" jefty to refirain the carrying Coaftwife of Salt-" petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Am-" munition :" — And the Lords Commillioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Commissioners for Ex-ecuting the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General of the Ordnance, and His Majefty's Secretary at War, are to give the neceflary Directions herein as to them may refpectively apper-G.
