And whereas feveral of the faid Deserters have been apprehended, and are now in Gool or in Regimental Cullody: His Majetty is likewise pleased to grant to them His Free Pardon, of which they are to have the Benefit, upon heir Arrival at their respective Regiments, or upon their being inlisted by fome other Corps, or Recruiting Party.

Majesty's most gracious Intentions are made Public, shall not be included in the above Pardon, but be proceeded against with the utmost Severity.
