Berlin, March 19.

HIS Royal Highness Prince Henry of Prussia intends to set out Tomorrow for Peterburg, attended by Baron Kniphausen the Younger; the two Messrs. Wreech, and General Hordt.

Willemslad, March 26. This Morning the Embarkation of the Hereditary Prince of Hesse Castell's Regiment, in His Britannick Majesty's Service, was completed, and the Ships are in Readiness to depart as soon as the Wind will permit.

Portsmouth, March 29. Yesterday and the preceding Day arrived at Spithead the greatest Part of the Fleet from Stade, with the First Division of the Brunswick Troops in His Majesty's Service; and this Day arrived the Remainder: They are preparing for their immediate Departure for North America.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, That in the Morning of the 22d of February last,

it was discovered, that an Attempt had been made the preceding Night, by Persons unknown, to break into a Cellar in the Port of Dover, in which were deposited Goods belonging to the Crown, by breaking a large Hole in the Wall under the outward Door; but there being two other strong Doors, they were prevented from getting into the Cellar, though they had endeavoured to effect it by an Instrument, which is judged to be an Iron Crow; and that in the same Night they also attempted another Cellar, made Use of for the like Purpose, and endeavoured to force off the Iron Bar of the outward Door, which was secured by two Locks, one of which they forced, and broke the other, but could not get it off: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the said Offence, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, who shall discover his, her, or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And, as a farther Encouragement, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs do hereby promise a Reward of FIFTY POUNDS to the Person making such Discovery as aforesaid; to be paid by the Receiver-General of His Majesty's Customs, upon the Conviction of any one or more of the said Offenders.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that in the Beginning of the Month of February last, the Ship Thomas, Captain William Robde, on a Voyage from Bourdeaux to Hamburg, was stranded off the Islands of Scilly, and Part of it's Cargo saved and lodged in Warehouses there; and that at sundry Times, between the Night of the 23d, and the Morning of the 28th of the said Month, one of the Warehouses was unroofed, and Seven Casks of Indigo stolen thereout: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the said Robberies, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, not already in Custody, who shall discover his or her Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they, may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
